There are two ways that you may complete Spanish Competency requirements:

- 1) **Complete all required Spanish competency courses at an accredited college or university:** Generally, upper level (300-400 level) Spanish or Modern Foreign Language courses will fulfill your remaining Spanish competencies.
- 2.) **Students who have learned Spanish without formal academic credit in a college or university may complete the following requirements:**
 - Achieved a minimum **score of 600** on the **Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)** (250 on the computer-based exam or 100 on the Internet-based exam), if English is not the native language. TOEFL Testing Information website: <http://www.ets.org/toefl/>
*Native speakers of English are exempt from this test. **Note:** The VDOE may require TOEFL Exam, if English is not the native language.
 - Achieved a qualifying score ("advanced low") on the **ACTFL OPI (Oral Proficiency Interview)** and **WPT (Writing Proficiency Test)**

 - Earned a minimum of **3 semester hours of “methods of teaching foreign languages”** at the elementary and secondary levels from an accredited college or university in the United States.
