### PROGRAM DIRECTOR UPDATES

- **Administration & Supervision:** Dunnick / Smith
  - Marla Behler is working on the following data reports:
    - Spring 2024 trial data tables for all course-embedded benchmark assessments.
    - 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 SLLA data tables.

- NELP Cycle 1 data collection will occur at the end of fall 2024 with analysis completed in spring 2024.
- Final NELP report is due March 2026.
- **Math Specialist:** Jones – Numbers continue to be relatively small. EDMS courses will be revised to update the curriculum to make it more current.
- **Reading Specialist:** Talada
  - The national Science of Reading movement continues to focus on a “return to the basics” in reading instruction. Our team maintains constant awareness of this movement and works to evaluate our coursework to ensure alignment to the Science of Reading and Virginia’s guidelines for literacy instruction.
  - As program director, I’ve even been able to work with SOE to develop coursework related to literacy that will ensure that we are able to meet the Science of Reading requirements in states all over the country. We’ve developed EDLC 515 and a corresponding undergraduate course to meet these requirements.
- **School Counseling:** Kuba / Bowles – Licensure compliance has been a focus to ensure that all out-of-state requirements are met or are reciprocated.

## DISCUSSION ITEMS

1. **NELP Timeline:** See the NELP Timeline in Appendix B at the end of the minutes. The timeline sets deadlines for data collection and analysis in preparation for the NELP report due in March 2026. Currently, we are waiting for the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 SLLA Cycle 1 data report with completers only. The original data included non-completers. Also, we are waiting for a trial run of all NELP assessments from spring 2024.
2. **CORE Update:** DeJarnette – The transition from LiveText to CORE is going smoothly with expected adjustments as needed. Our team is working with CORE to ensure data reports are disaggregated as needed for CAEP.
3. **Data Analysis:** DeJarnette – See PowerPoint: [PowerPoint for Fall 2024 Meeting: October 16, 2024](#)
  - **Advanced Licensure Enrollment**
    - Concern was voiced that requiring a Virginia initial license at admissions (through the Gate process) and an advanced Virginia license (at Gate 4) may negatively impact enrollment. As noted in the update above, the School Counseling program is meeting state requirements or ensuring reciprocity rather than requiring an application for a Virginia license at Gate 4; their program does not require an initial teaching license, so that is not an issue for the School Counseling program.
  - **Pre-AIA & AIA:** Pre-AIA does not have an “Advanced” option of 4 points, so both means and percentages are lower than for the AIA.
    - Administration & Supervision: Trends that carry over from Pre-AIA to AIA:
      - Strongest rating continues to be for “Ethics & Professional Norms.”

- “Operations & Management” continued to be a low rating for the Fall 2023 cycle but not for Spring 2024. It should be monitored further, but it is not a strong trend in these cycles.
  - Reading & Math Specialist: Performance is overall strong. With relatively low numbers, trends are difficult to identify.
  - School Counseling: High scores are for foundations, which includes ethics; this is true for both the Pre-AIA and the AIA.
- **VEAC Completer Survey**
  - Administration & Supervision
    - Highest
      - 3.75 – Professional, moral, & ethical standards; personal integrity.
      - 3.69 – What does this mean? “This competency did not apply to my preparation”? It is a preface to “Reflective understanding of moral and legal consequences.” It appears that it might be a misplaced column header for a rating. If so, could this be corrected so it’s not related to this particular competency?
    - Lowest
      - Data-driven decision-making.
      - Technology to support management and communication.
  - School Counseling
    - Highest: Professionalism; legal and ethical considerations.
    - Lowest
      - Student appraisal and assessment.
      - Research and evaluation skills.
  - Math Specialist
    - Highest
      - Measurement and evaluation.
      - Communication skills.
    - Lowest
      - Coaching and supporting teachers.
      - Organizing and supervising the reading program.
      - Research.
      - Technology.
  - Reading Specialist
    - Highest
      - Leadership and collaboration.

#### 4. Discussion & Feedback: DeJarnette

- **After reviewing the data sets, what are your initial thoughts?**
  - Ethics, foundations, and integrity are overall strengths.
  - School Counseling has already implemented changes in the Fall 2023 DCP for the new 60-hour program that addresses leadership, collaboration, consultation, etc. This should eventually lead to completers being more satisfied in their preparation for leadership. Although candidates tend to struggle with data and research, other changes have already addressed this. For example, COSC 661 is returning to an intensive format where students will receive in-person guidance regarding program development and evaluation. In COSC 612 (Advanced School Counseling Interventions) and COSC 662 (School Counselors as Leaders), revisions have already been implemented to strengthen in-depth research and leadership. It may be two years for these revisions to impact the VEAC Completer Survey.
- **What do you see as areas of strength for LU SOE programs?** – Ethics, foundations, equity, and integrity are overall strengths.
- **What do you see as areas for improvement for LU SOE programs?** – Overall areas for improvement include research, data-driven decision-making, and applications of digital technologies. Though candidates are exposed to data and are required to make data-driven decisions, the amount of data is much less than what completers experience in their new roles. Their adjustment from reviewing limited data as a candidate to the large amounts of data reviewed in their new role may lead to these low ratings.
- **In light of today's educational and cultural landscape, what do you see as an essential priority or skill development needed for candidate preparation?** – To fulfill Liberty University's mission, candidates are to be prepared to integrate faith principles and a biblical worldview into their careers. Considering today's educational and cultural landscape, this continues to be an increasing challenge.
