New Business Items:

Presented by Dr. Rice:

1. Simulation Classrooms Expansion

- Liberty has expanded its elementary simulation classroom initiative to include secondary classrooms.
- Funded by the Dean Excellence Fund, these classrooms now include movable desks and traditional secondary classroom items.
- Students use these spaces for practice teaching, video reflection, and peer collaboration.

2. Professional Development Video Library

- A new PD video library was launched in August.
- Topics were selected based on partner feedback from previous GAC meetings.
- Videos are designed for use in PLCs and faculty meetings and are available on the SOE partnership website.
- Partners are encouraged to suggest future topics via email.

3. Local Partnership Breakfast

- Liberty hosted a breakfast for local school leaders (public, private, and Christian schools within an hour radius).
- Purpose: to gather feedback and understand local needs.
- Featured speaker: Dr. Watson (Music Education).

- Available residentially and online.
- Designed for paraprofessionals or others seeking licensure.

Data Sharing & Accreditation

Advanced Licensure Programs

- Administration & Supervision (MED, EdS, EdD): Strong performance across all five assessment components.
- Math & Reading Specialist Programs: Small cohorts but high scores; Liberty seeks to grow these programs.

Initial Licensure - edTPA Data

- edTPA is required at Liberty, though not mandated by Virginia.
- Tasks include Planning, Instruction, Assessment, and (for Elementary) Math Re-teaching.
- Liberty candidates generally score above benchmark, though slightly below national averages in some areas.

• Elementary Math (Task 4) identified as an area for improvement.

Partner Feedback Highlights

Strengths of LU Candidates

- Strong work ethic, initiative, and positive attitude.
- Candidates are well-prepared, organized, and tech-savvy.
- Appreciation for CORE platform usability and flexibility.

Areas for Growth

- Some partners noted the need for more career-switcher support.
- Continued refinement in math re-teaching and assessment practices.

Advanced Candidates

- Positive feedback on project contributions and volunteerism.
- Some partners requested more visibility into advanced program outcomes.

Data & Partnership Engagement

- Partners value receiving graduate rosters for recruitment.
- Desire for continued access to student progress data, exit surveys, and VEAC employer feedback.
