
Healthy Success in the Classroom

The Liberty University Mock Trial Teams recently wrapped up a successful competition season. Liberty sent three teams to Regional Competitions in February. The competitions were held over zoom, which allowed the Teams to compete against Colleges from across the Country. Liberty finished the Regional Competitions with two teams placing as Regional Champions, which earned them a spot in the Open Round Championship Series Tournament! Only 192 of over 600 nationwide teams qualify out of Regionals for the Open Round Championship Series Tournament.
