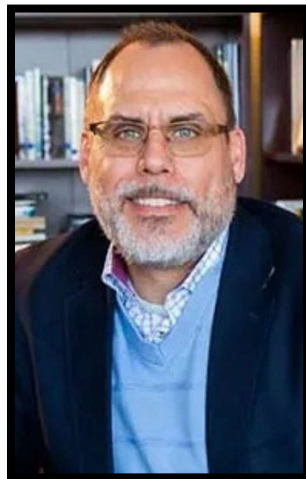

**Dr. Edna Udobong** leads faculty from many Liberty University departments on a Fulbright Committee. She is also the advisor for the Faculty and Student International Scholarship and Fellowship Programs for the Fulbright Scholar Program, the Fulbright U.S. Students Program, and the Gilman Scholarship Program. As a Fulbright Scholar herself, she has served as a peer and discipline reviewer for two Africa regional exchange programs within the Council for the Exchange of Scholars. Dr. Udobong has been published in many international law journals including the African Journal of International and Comparative Law. Her work has reached over 150 countries.



**Mr. Marco Margheri** is Head of Eni's US Relations and Chairman of Eni New Energies US Inc. He is also a Board Member for the Atlantic Council, a member of the European Council on Foreign Relations and Chair for Italy of the World Energy Council. Prior to joining Eni, he was Italy's Edison Executive Vice-President for Sustainability, Institutions & Regulation overseeing activities in Rome and Brussels, and held positions with GE Oil & Gas and Cohn Wolfe. Mr. Margheri is also a visiting professor at LUISS Guido Carli University in Rome, a member of the Italian press and an Honorary Member of the Milano per la Scala Foundation in Milan.



**Mr. Joseph Harris** is the Fiscal Policy Analyst for the John Locke Foundation. He previously worked in education, teaching Economics and Public Policy courses at numerous colleges in North Carolina. Joseph graduated from the University of North Carolina Wilmington (UNCW) with a Bachelor of Arts in Economics and a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science. He also earned a Master of Public Administration at UNCW and a Master of Science in Economics from Florida State University in Tallahassee, Florida.



**Ms. Joy Cover** serves as the President of Freedom 4/24, a non-profit with the mission of preventing and ending sexual exploitation and trafficking. Freedom 4/24 raises awareness, provides prevention education, and supports organization working to end exploitation by providing a pathway to freedom for trafficked and exploited women and children. Ms. Cover's non-profit work has included experience in identifying priority needs within a community, developing organizational strategy and education initiatives, program implementation and management, and international staff management.



**First Sergeant Justin Cowan** currently serves as the Commander of the Human Trafficking Unit for the Virginia State Police. Since the establishment of the Department's Human Trafficking, First Sergeant Cowan has played a pivotal role in developing and overseeing the anti-trafficking program and training initiatives within the agency. He also manages the human trafficking tipline, supervises human trafficking investigators assigned to the unit, and regional task forces. Prior to his tenure in the Human Trafficking Unit, First Sergeant Cowan accumulated valuable experience as a violent crime investigator, patrol canine handler, and crash reconstructionist. He is a graduate of the Virginia Forensic Science Academy and holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice from Liberty University.



**Dr. Amanda Trent** has held various leadership positions in corrections, leaning on her experience as a law enforcement officer and her work in the jail. She eventually joined Liberty University's Helms School of Government as a professor and has since been promoted to Associate Dean over Residential Programs. Dr. Trent currently maintains an active role in corrections, traveling the state to provide training and consulting on mental health and substance abuse trends. She also serves on the Virginia Board of Local and Regional Jails as an appointee of Governor Glenn Youngkin.



**Dr. Amber Wilson** previously served as the Manager of Aviation Technology for the Virginia Department of Aviation, where she guided the Commonwealth's growth and oversight of aviation technologies, including Advanced Air Mobility (AAM). Dr. Wilson is now recognized as a subject matter expert in AAM, allowing her to testify on related topics including national and international discussions on aviation policy and human trafficking. She currently serves on the Unmanned Systems Advisory Board for the Virginia Unmanned Systems Center at the Virginia Innovation Partnership Corporation and the Advisory Board for UnTrafficked. Her Ph.D. dissertation focused on aviation's role in human trafficking.



**Dr. Zoltán Fehér** is a diplomat-scholar and a geostrategist with more than twenty years of experience working in government, academia, and the private sector on international relations, foreign policy, grand strategy, and geopolitical risk. He is currently a Visiting Scholar at the Institute for Security and Conflict Studies (ISCS), Elliott School of International Affairs, and a Professorial Lecturer at the Department of Political Science, George Washington University, as well as a Nonresident Fellow with the Atlantic Council's Global China Hub.



**Dr. Wayne Hugar** is the Program Director for the National Intelligence University's China Intelligence Education Programs covering China, Taiwan, and the broader Indo-Pacific region. Dr. Hugar served for 21 years as a U.S. Naval Intelligence Officer in various assignments throughout the Indo-Pacific and Middle East regions. He has over 38 years of experience working in the U.S. intelligence community and has overseen the graduate education of over 2,500 military and civilian students through teaching and mentoring master's thesis research during the past 21 years.

**The Honorable George S. Dunlop** is a life-long entrepreneur as an equity partner in business ventures, and he has 50-years of experience in leading, helping, and motivating people and organizations in the private sector, politics, and government to make things happen with clarity, integrity, and excellence. Previously, Mr. Dunlop has been Assistant Secretary of the U.S. Department of Agriculture for Natural Resources and the Environment in the Administration of President Ronald Reagan and for fourteen years was a senior executive for the United States Senate, serving as Administrative Assistant to Senator Jesse Helms.



**The Honorable Becky Dunlop** has been a prominent leader, strategist, and counselor in the conservative movement. Mrs. Dunlop serves on several boards and advises a wide range of leaders and organizations. **Dr. Todd Gathje** is Vice President of Government Relations at The Family Foundation. Prior to joining The Family Foundation, he worked for the Virginia Department of Education and managed the state’s School Choice program. This program has become one of the most effective initiatives for giving more parents greater options in providing the best quality education for their children. He also spent time at the Attorney General’s Office under then Attorney General Bob McDonnell. Dr. Gathje’s public policy interests include school choice, stem cell research, foster care and adoption, and the protection of religious liberty.
