




How to Navigate Courses in Canvas


There are multiple ways to access your courses in Canvas. In [How to Navigate the Canvas Dashboard](#), we discussed that the default view is the Card View. In this view, courses appear as tiles on the dashboard and can be opened by a simple click of the tile.



Alternatively, you can use the Courses tab from the Canvas Menu to open a panel with a list of your courses, and then select a course.




Canvas Menu




Courses Panel

Home

The Home page is your default landing page for the course, which provides a summary view of all of the course modules, along with recent announcements.




On the right side, there are links to the Course Stream and the Course Calendar.



Course Stream

The Course Stream acts as a time line for your class, and shows messages from discussion boards, gradebook updates, and messages between you and others.






Discussions
