

# How to Navigate Courses in Canvas

## Introduction



There are multiple ways to access your courses in Canvas. In How to Navigate the Canvas Dashboard, we discussed that the default view is the Card View. In this view, courses appear as tiles on the dashboard and can be opened by a simple click of the tile.



Alternatively, you can use the Courses tab from the Canvas Menu to open a panel with a list of your courses, and then select a course.
