




Sources of International Law

The original "game plan" of the Founding Fathers of the United Nations international human rights program was, first, to spell out in a non-binding Universal Declaration of Human Rights' the general principles falling within the phrase "human rights and fundamental freedoms" found in the UN Charter, and then to draft a covenant (which later became two covenants) and various specific conventions relating to particular human rights that would contain legally binding obligations together with implementation provisions for those states that ratified such treaties (Richard B. Lillich).

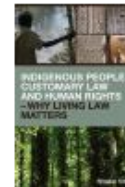

Abstract: **Trafficking** in girls into prostitution is a global problem and has been destroying the lives of thousands of innocent victims resulting in physical and mental violence and various kinds of diseases. It violates the **human rights** of the victims, many of which are non-derogable under any circumstances. Nepalese victims trafficked into prostitution are a group of such victims who have been trafficked in brothels in India in large number every year because of the grim socio-legal discrimination at home. The apathy, neglect and discrimination practices by the States (Nepal and India), including the judiciary, on this problem have further increased suffering of the victims. This thesis argues that as parties to the various international **human rights** laws, it is the responsibility of Nepal and India to fulfill their commitments by making their national laws effective in order to prevent **trafficking** and protect **human rights** of the victims without any discrimination.; (AN 70528076)

2. Assessing the implications of the Swedish prostitution and trafficking model

Abstract: The 'Swedish model' of law related to prostitution and **trafficking** has been hailed by abolitionist feminists as a progressive approach to both problems. It is an approach centered primarily on reducing male demand for sexual services, and at undermining its legitimacy. It is also cognizant of how, in other countries, state support or tolerance of prostitution allows **trafficking** to flourish. The Swedish approach has been seen as a viable alternative to promoting an industry based on subordination, violence, and exploitation. This thesis argues that the Swedish approach to the problems of **trafficking** in **human** beings for the purposes of sexual exploitation and prostitution has been severely undermined by another competing set of laws: draconian immigration policies. In recent years these policies have been driven not only by national but also by supranational, European Union, imperatives. This has created a situation in which the issue of **trafficking** is treated as a matter of illegal migration. Criminal law, labor law and **human rights** protections are all denied to trafficked **women**, contrary to the requirements of the 'Swedish model'. The result has been that trafficked **women** are most often forcibly deported from Sweden without adequate measures to ensure their safety in repatriation.; (AN 70528319)

The United Nations came into being in 1945, following the devastation of the Second World War, with one central mission: the maintenance of international peace and security. The UN does this by working to prevent conflict; helping parties in conflict make peace; peacekeeping; and creating the conditions to allow peace to hold and flourish. These activities often overlap and should reinforce one another, to be effective. The UN Security Council has the primary responsibility for international peace and security. The General Assembly and the Secretary-General play major, important, and complementary roles, along with other UN offices and bodies.

Protect Human Rights

The term “human rights” was mentioned seven times in the UN’s founding [Charter](#), making the promotion and protection of human rights a key purpose and guiding principle of the Organization. In 1948, the [Universal Declaration of Human Rights](#) brought human rights into the realm of international law. Since then, the Organization has diligently protected human rights through legal instruments and on-the-ground activities.

How does the UN promote and protect human rights?

High Commissioner for Human Rights

The [Office of the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights](#) (OHCHR) has lead responsibility in the UN system for the promotion and protection of [human rights](#). The office supports the human rights components of peacekeeping missions in several countries, and has many country and regional offices and centres. The [High Commissioner for Human Rights](#) regularly comments on [human rights situations in the world](#) and has the authority to investigate situations and issue reports on them.

Human Rights Council

The [Human Rights Council](#), established in 2006, replaced the 60-year-old UN Commission on Human Rights as the key independent UN intergovernmental body responsible for human rights.

Human Rights Treaty Bodies

The [human rights treaty bodies](#) are committees of independent experts that monitor implementation of the core international human rights treaties



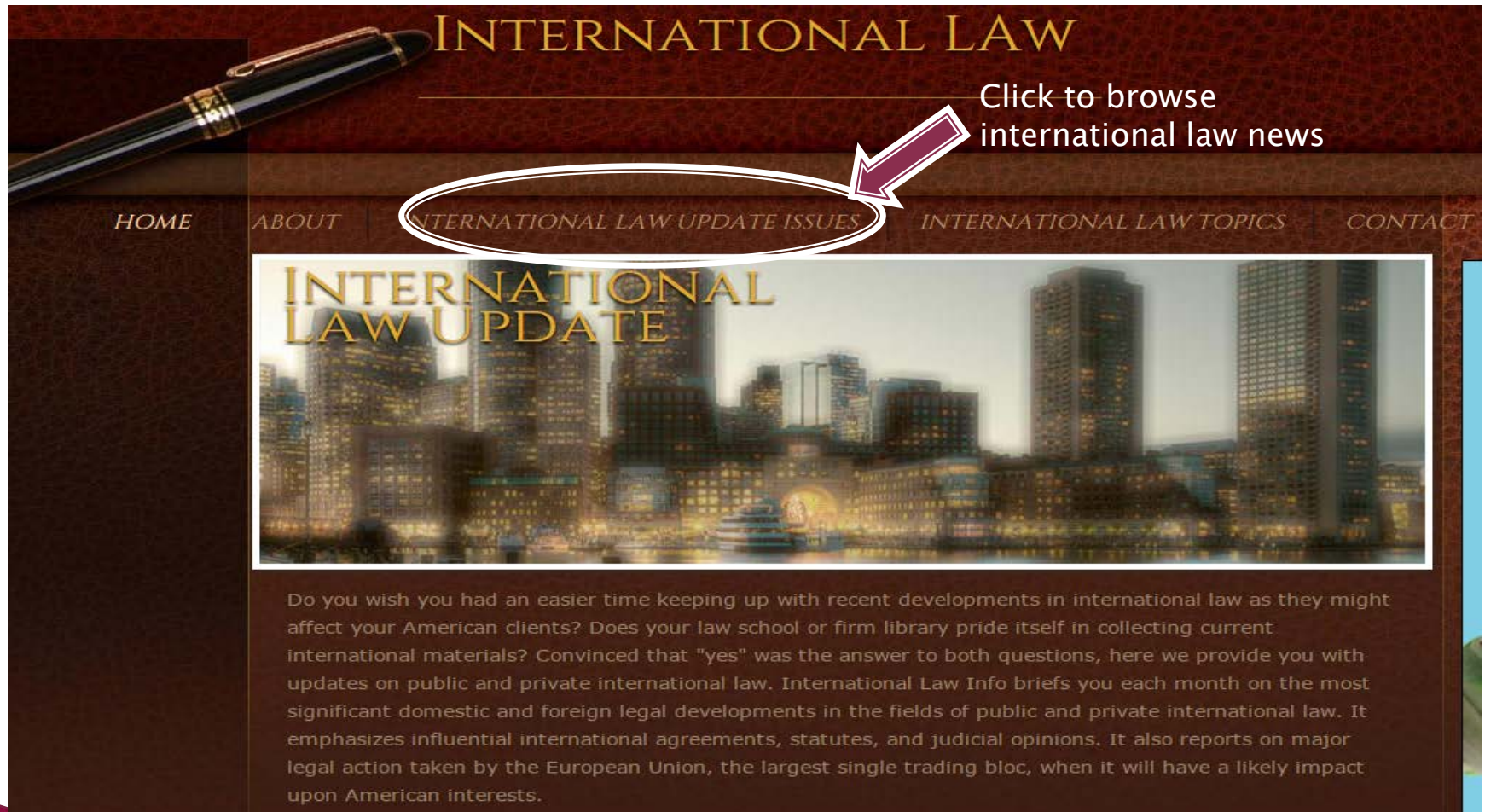


