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**Below are important concepts for LUCOM-OMM Student-Doctor Fellow applicants to consider:**

1. Applicants will be interviewed by LUCOM-OMM faculty with recommendations to the Office of the Dean for finale selection.
2. Participants are given an \$18,000 stipend each year.
3. Participants are given an additional \$3,000 in development funds to attend specific approved events and conferences.
4. Participants are awarded a one-year tuition waiver to be spread over the final two-years of the LUCOM curriculum (does not include Liberty and LUCOM fees).
5. Participants must have had > 80 average overall and > 80% average overall for LUCOM-OMM for first two years of curriculum.
6. Participants must pass COMLEX-I on first attempt (may be selected for program prior to this requirement but if requirement is not met, participant must step down).
7. Participants must never have been on suspension and/or probation. Good academic standing is required.
8. Participants will have ½ day per week of OMM clinic time with LUCOM faculty.
9. Participants will have ½ day a week of continuity care in an assigned primary care medical clinic throughout the academic year.

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**Graduate Teaching Assistant (GTA) responsibilities include:**

1. Assist with teaching in OMM Lab two afternoons a week.
2. Assist with OMM examinations and evaluations.
3. Assist in presentation of OMM lecture subject matter, small groups, etc., and attend all OMM lectures, prep, sessions, etc.
4. Teach at least one OMM lecture or one OMM lab per semester.
5. May conduct approved research/publication project over course of academic year.
6. Assist with monthly OMM labs for OMS-III student-doctors.
7. Be available to tutor student-doctors in OMM at least four-hours each week.
8. Assist with Clinical Medicine, Standardized Patients and Simulation evaluations when needed.
9. Additional responsibilities/requests as appointed by the Chair of Department of OMM.
