Strategies for Success

- Take advantage of the opportunities to hear speakers during Spiritual Emphasis Week, Youth Emphasis Week, Missions Emphasis Week, and Convocation.
- Be faithful and consistent in spiritual disciplines; maintain a strong testimony and commit Scripture to memory.
- Plan to attend and connect with speakers at Women's Ministry Emphasis Week held each semester at Liberty University.
- Stay plugged in with campus church or a local church in the surrounding area.
- Volunteer with a variety of nonprofit organizations and/or go on mission trips.
- Develop leadership abilities and self-discipline; cultivate high moral and ethical standards.
- Consider a minor in an area of talent that could benefit a ministry and complement interests.
- Identify the causes, people groups, and topics that are the most exciting.
- Practice public speaking, if relevant.
- Find accountability partners on both the peer and mentor levels.
- Attend women's conferences, Bible studies, retreats, as well as follow women's ministry leaders on social media.
- Consider spending a summer working at a Christian camp for young children or adolescents.
- Become adept at recruiting volunteers and participants.
- Volunteer at home church, on visits, and breaks.
- Serve others, while remembering to attend to one's own spiritual, physical, and emotional well-being.
- Consider graduate school for counseling, education, or seminary.
- Start networking and building your connections now.

Holland Codes

The Holland Code system is designed to connect individuals with the career field that best fits their personality. The system scores the test taker on six separate scales: Realistic (R), Investigative (I), Artistic (A), Social (S), Enterprising (E), and Conventional (C). The two or three highest scores represent an individual's strongest attributes. Here are a few examples of positions associated with this major:

- Director of Religious Organization (EAS)
- Writer (AIE)
- Counselor (SAE)
- Music Minister (ASE)
- Motivational Speaker (EAS)
- Lobbyist (EAS)
- Camp Counselor (SEA)
- Childcare (SAE)
- Residential Director (SCE)
