Professional Tips. . . .

Habits affect the way we live at home, work, school and socially. So we need to be sure our habits produce effective results. How long does it take to form a habit? Experts agree that after consistently repeating a behavior for 21 days it becomes a habit and we no longer have to force ourselves to do it. No skipping! If you miss a day, you don't pick up where you left off. You start over!

Habits cannot be stopped. Instead, we need to replace the undesirable behavior with a new, desirable one. These five steps will help. The more you know about what you do, when and why you do it, the better chance you will have to replace the behavior:

- 1) Identify the old habit
- 2) Define the new habit
- 3) Begin the new habit strongly
- 4) Never deviate for at least 21 days
- 5) Ask for help to keep you on track

Biblical Thought


Romans 12:6-8 (NIV)
