Graduation Requirements

- Complete 60 hours
- A minimum of 45 hours must be completed through Liberty University, not to include credits from a prior degree earned through Liberty
- A maximum of 15 hours of transfer credit, including credit from a degree on the same academic level previously earned through Liberty, may be applied to the degree^{*}
- 3.0 GPA
- No grades lower than a B- may be applied to the degree
- Three courses required in Residence¹
- Passing score on Comprehensive Exam
- Successful defense of Dissertation
- Degree must be completed within 7 years^{**}
- Please submit a Graduation Application to the Registrar's Office at the beginning of the final semester

^{*}Applicants who have previously completed an Educational Specialist (Ed.S.) or equivalent degree from an institution accredited by an agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education will be considered for advanced standing (up to 24 hours) in the Ed.D. program. Students who have earned an Ed.S. degree through Liberty are permitted to apply up to 27 hours (as applicable) from that degree toward the Ed.D.
^{**}There is a limit of 5 years for completion of the Ed.D. for students who were granted 18 hours or more of advanced standing credit from a previously completed Ed.S. or equivalent degree.

- ¹Course offered in Residence (EDUC 730, 741, 915, 917, 919)
- ²An educational research course equivalent to EDUC 518 is a prerequisite to the Research & Evaluation Core.
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- ⁴EDUC 919 should be one of the final courses in the program; must be taken after completing EDUC 815 & 817.
- ⁵Background check clearance required (EDUC 919, 970, 980, 989, 990)
- ⁶Choose one of the following courses: EDUC 721, 735, 746 or 758
- ⁷Students may choose to take a 600-900 level Middle Grades Education or related content course instead. These courses must be approved by the School of Education.
- ⁸Once the student enters the Dissertation phase, he/she must maintain continuous enrollment (Fall, Spring, and Summer semesters) until all degree requirements are completed.
- ⁹EDUC 989 must be taken a minimum of two times. Any student who is not ready for enrollment in EDUC 990 after completing the second enrollment in EDUC 989 may be required, as determined by the student's dissertation chair, to repeat EDUC 989 until deemed ready for enrollment in EDUC 990.
- ¹⁰Ed.D. students are allowed to enroll in EDUC 989 a maximum of three times before their dissertation proposal is approved, and a maximum of nine times total. Extensions for exceptional circumstances must be approved by the Assistant Dean for Doctoral Programs and Research in the School of Education.

Initial Licensure additional courses required:

Elementary: EDUC 530, 531, 554, 556, 623¹, 632¹, student teaching, content competencies, VCLA, RVE, Praxis II

Special Education: EDUC 524, 525, 530, 554, 622¹, 623¹, student teaching, VCLA, RVE, Praxis II

Secondary: EDUC 535, 539, 556, 623¹, 673¹ student teaching, content competencies, VCLA, Praxis II

Add-on Licensure additional courses required and Field Experience Summary (45 hours)

Early Childhood (for 3- and 4-year-olds): EDUC 501, 653, 670, must have elementary license

Gifted: EDUC 526, 620, 621, 627, must have initial license

Advanced Licensure additional courses required:

School Counseling: Master's Degree in Counseling; EDUC 600, 622, 33 hours of EDCE courses as listed on M.Ed. in School Counselor DCP

Reading or Math Specialist: EDUC 622¹, 641¹, 650, 652, 699-A03, must have initial license and 3 years experience

Also for **Math:** EDUC 530, Praxis II or **Reading:** EDUC 554, 556, RVE

School Administration: EDUC 641¹, 648, 672, 699-A01; equivalent course from master's accepted for EDUC 672
