Today's Game

No. 22/20 Liberty closes out a brief two-game homestand by hosting No. 13/14 James Madison at Williams Stadium in a clash between a pair of Top 25 Commonwealth programs this Saturday.

Similar Paths

Liberty and James Madison enter tonight's match-up with identical 1-1 records, both gained by pursuing very similar paths. The pair of teams both opened the season with loses to ACC programs, with Liberty dropping a 43-21 decision at N.C. State and James Madison falling, 42-10, at North Carolina. Last weekend, Liberty opened its 2011 home slate with a 38-7 victory over defending NEC champion Robert Morris, while the Dukes scored a 14-9 win over NEC foe Central Connecticut State.

National Spotlight

Tonight's match-up between No. 22/20 Liberty and No. 13/14 James Madison is one of two meetings between nationally ranked FCS programs around the country. The other will take place in Missoula, Mont., when defending national champion No. 10/10 Eastern Washington travels to Washington-Grizzly Stadium to face No. 12/11 Montana.

Looking for No. 200

The Flames enter tonight's match-up with James Madison with an overall program record of 199-198-4 in 39 years of gridiron action, meaning a win over the Dukes would be the program's 200th overall victory.

Streaking Flames

Liberty opened up the home portion of its 2011 slate, last Saturday, with a 38-7 victory over Robert Morris, a 2010 NCAA FCS Playoff participant. The victory pushed Liberty's winning streak to nine straight inside of Williams Stadium, which is currently tied for the fourth-longest home winning streak in the country by FCS programs.

The Last Time

Liberty is currently on a nine-game winning streak inside Williams Stadium, which is the fourth longest FCS home winning streak in the country. The last team to upend Liberty at home was James Madison, when the No. 6 Dukes bested both the Flames and a soaking rain storm to secure a 24-10 victory on Sept. 26, 2009.

Honors Abound

Following a 38-7 victory over Robert Morris, Liberty secured two of the four weekly Big South player honors handed out by the league this week. Quarterback Mike Brown was named Offensive Player of the Week for the ninth time of his career, while defensive back Kevin Fogg secured his first career weekly accolade by being named the league's Big South Defensive Player of the Week.

Last Time Against - No. 3/3 James Madison 10, No. 22/21 Liberty 3

Sept. 25, 2010 - Harrisonburg, Va. - Bridgeforth Stadium (16,385)

No. 3/3 James Madison used a third-quarter field goal to give the Dukes a cushion and then outlasted the No. 22/21 Liberty in a defensive struggle, claiming a 10-3 victory inside of Bridgeforth Stadium.

The victory kept James Madison unbeaten on the season and ups the Dukes' record to 3-0. The loss, Liberty's second in row, dropped the Flames' record to 2-2 and closes out a three-game road swing.

The game remained scoreless until the fourth play of the second quarter, but it was a play late in the first quarter that allowed Liberty to take the early 3-0 edge.

Liberty's second drive of the game stalled at its own 32-yard line, following a deep pass downfield from Mike Brown to Chris Summers along the sideline. However, punter Mike Larsson was interfered with on the attempted punt, giving Liberty 15 extra yards and a new set of downs.

Brown completed his next four pass attempts to drive Liberty down to the goal line, but his floating pass to tight end Tommy Shaver in the endzone was just out of the reach of the tight end, forcing Liberty to settle for three points. Matt Bevins' 19-yard field goal at the 13:28 mark of the second completed an 18-play, 95-yard drive that ate up 9:40 on the game clock and staked Liberty to the early lead.

The score remained the same until the waning minutes of the first half. For the second time in the half, Liberty crossed midfield, getting to the Dukes' 31-yard line, which prompted head coach Danny Rocco to elect to go for it on fourth and a short one. But for the third time this year, Liberty was shut down on a fourth-down play, as Brown was not able to get the nose of the football beyond the yardage marker.

Two plays later, James Madison quarterback Drew Dudzik showed his athleticism, as the redshirt senior got outside the pocket and scampered 39 yards downfield to Liberty 25-yard line. On the next play, the quarterback dropped back and found a wide-open Griff Yancey for a score, giving James Madison the 7-3 edge with 53 seconds left in the period.

Following the quick scoring drive at the end of the half, James Madison headed into the locker room at the intermission with a

164-149 total offensive yardage edge. Liberty picked up most of its yardage via the passing game (102 yards), while James Madison rushed for the same amount of yards (102) on 16 carries.

Following a three-and-out series to open the second half for James Madison, Liberty managed to once again drive to James Madison's 30-yard line. However, a 47-yard field goal attempt by Bevins was blocked at the line of scrimmage, keeping the score the same on Bevin's fifth 40-plus yard attempt of the year.

The blocked field goal by the Dukes eventually led to three additional points for the home squad. James Madison elected to keep the ball on the ground for eight of the next drive's nine plays.

On a third-and-two play from Liberty's four-yard line, Danny Broggin and Terry Adams were able to get behind the line of scrimmage and stop Scott Nobles for a one-yard loss, leaving James Madison to settle for a 22-yard field goal by Dixon Wright with 6:23 left in the third quarter.

The remainder of the game belonged to the defensive players, as the two squad's offensive players managed to pick up just seven additional first downs during the last 21 minutes of the contest.

Liberty managed to cross the 50-yard line on two of its last four drives of the evening. The last time the Flames touched the football, Liberty found itself needing to piece together a 79-yard touchdown drive with just over three and half minutes left to play. Brown found Shaver open on a 16-yard strike over the middle of the field on the first play, but three plays later, the quarterback was flushed from the pocket, forcing a deep pass downfield. But the pass was picked off, as Taveion Coffee was able to step in front of the effort and pull it in just before he fell out of bounds.

James Madison kept the ball on the ground for the next three plays, including a game-sealing three-yard effort by Nobles, who got to the outside and was able to stretch the football out just enough to get first down and allow the home squad to run the rest of the game clock out.

The second 30 minutes of the game was even more of a defensive effort, as James

Madison finished the last two quarters with 119 total offensive yards to Liberty's 115.

Liberty's game-ending 264 total offensive yards marks the eighth time Liberty has failed to cross the 300-yard threshold in the five years under Rocco. It is also the second-straight game Liberty has failed to finish a game against James Madison with more than 300 total offensive yards after finished last year's rain-soaked contest with 217 total offensive yards.

The game also marked the second time that Liberty has finished a game in the last five years without a touchdown. The last was a 10-3 loss at Towson on Sept. 16, 2006.

Brown finished as Liberty's No. 1 rusher for the third week in a row. The quarterback rushed for 26 yards on 11 carries. Korrey Davis led the team in rushing attempts, finishing the game with 13 carries for 25 of Liberty's 61 team rushing yards. Nobles was James Madison's No. 1 rusher with 17 carries for 89 yards.

Brown finished the game by completing 21-of-32 for 203 yards, while his counterpart, Dudzik, was 6-of-14 for 78 yards and the eventual game-winning touchdown late in the second quarter.

Summers was Liberty's top receiver, finishing the game with eight catches for 66 yards, while Yancey caught two passes for 56 yards and the game's lone touchdown.

Kyle O'Donnell had a career night and led all tacklers with 14 stops, including 10 assisted tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and a forced fumble. Doncel Bolt followed with nine stops, including six solo tackles, followed by Chad Brown's eight-tackle effort.

Following three road games in a row, Liberty will return to Williams Stadium next weekend for the grand re-opening of its on-campus facility. During the last nine months, the stadium has undergone an extensive renovation, expanding the stadium seating capacity from 12,000 to 19,200 and adding a five-story press and suite tower.

News and Notes about Liberty's recent Match-Up with Robert Morris

- Liberty is now 6-0 in home openers under head coach Danny Rocco.
- The Flames have won their six home openers under head coach Danny Rocco by an average of 29.0 points per game (239 total points scored to 65 points allowed).
- Liberty has now won nine games in a row at Williams Stadium, which is tied for the fourth-longest FCS home winning streak in the country.
- In six home openers under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames have allowed an average of 213.0 total offensive yards per game.
- The game was played in front of 15,803 fans, marking the sixth largest single-game crowd in Williams Stadium history.
- Robert Morris finished with 14 more total offensive plays than Liberty during the game (69 to 56). However, Liberty almost doubled up Robert Morris' average gain per play – 6.3 to 3.4.
- Robert Morris finished the game with 234 total offensive yards, marking the 24th time under head coach Danny Rocco the Flames have held an opponent to less than 300 total offensive yards in a game.
- After allowing only 234 total offensive yards to Robert Morris, the Flames now rank No. 14 nationally in total defense (276.0 yards allowed per game).
- Liberty, which dramatically cut back on its number of turnovers against Robert Morris, finished the game with just one (a fumble), as compared to seven turnovers against N.C. State.
- Liberty finished the Robert Morris game with three interceptions.
- In six years under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames have finished 23 games with multiple interceptions and six games with three or more intercepted passes.
- Liberty currently ranks No. 12 nationally in passes intercepted (3).
- Robert Morris was the second-straight opponent the Flames have held under 200 passing yards, as the Colonials finished the game with 117 total passing yards.
- Liberty currently ranks No. 15 in the country in passing defense, allowing an average of 136.50 passing yards per game.
- Liberty also ranks No. 11 nationally in pass efficiency defense (92.38), after allowing Robert Morris to complete just 13-of-28 passing attempts.
- Liberty finished the Robert Morris game with four sacks for a loss of 34 total yards.
- Liberty has recorded four sacks in both its games in 2011 and now ranks No. 9 nationally in sacks per game (4.0).
- The Flames allowed Robert Morris to pick up 16 first downs during the game and Liberty now ranks No. 29 nationally in first down defense (16.50 allowed per game).
- The Flames' defense only allowed Robert Morris to convert on 3-of-14 third-down plays on the night.
- The Flames had their second-straight 200-yard passing game (233 yards) and currently rank No. 21 in the country in passing offense (264.0 average passing yards per game).
- Robert Morris was the first team in nine games to hold the Flames to less than 40 points scored in a home game.
- During Liberty's current nine-game home winning streak, the Flames are averaging 48.89 points scored per game.
- During the Flames' current nine-game home winning streak, Liberty has out-scored its opponents 440-136, which is an average margin of victory of 33.78 points per game.
- During Liberty's current nine-game home winning streak, the Flames have only allowed one opponent to score more than 20 points in a game (28 by Stony Brook on Nov. 20, 2010).
- Liberty's lost loss inside of Williams Stadium took place on Sept. 26, 2009, when the Flames fell to No. 6 James Madison, 24-10.
- The Flames finished the Robert Morris game converting on 7-of-13 third-down plays and now rank No. 23 nationally in third-down conversion percentage (44.44/12-of-27).
- The Flames had their first special teams touchdown of the 2011 season, when Kevin Fogg returned a fourth quarter kickoff 88 yards for a score against Robert Morris.
- Liberty now ranks No. 8 nationally in kickoff returns, averaging 31.00 yards per return.

- The Flames are one of nine FCS teams in the country to have returned a kickoff for a touchdown in 2011.
- For the 13th-straight game, Mike Brown surpassed the 200 total offensive yard mark, finishing the Robert Morris game with 252 yards (43 rushing and 209 passing).

Mike Brown (R-Sr./QB)

- Mike Brown accounted for 71.0 percent of Liberty's total offensive yards against Robert Morris (252 to 355 total offensive yards).
- Mike Brown currently ranks No. 9 in the country in total offense, averaging 304.0 yards per game.
- Mike Brown currently ranks No. 11 nationally in rushing yards per game by a quarterback, as he is leading the Flames with 120 rushing yards in 2011 (60.0 per game).

On Aug. 28, 2009, during Liberty University's convocation service, Chancellor Jerry Falwell, Jr., announced plans for extensive stadium expansion at Williams Stadium and in the Vines Center, which will put Liberty's athletics facilities on par with those at the highest level of NCAA competition.

"I think these projects will take us to a higher level of competition," Falwell said. "It will put Liberty on the same level as other major universities in the state and in the region. I think it is amazing what we are accomplishing with God's help. The sky's the limit for Liberty."

Before a packed house inside the Vines Center, Falwell unveiled plans to increase Williams Stadium seating to 19,200 by the opening of the 2010 season, plus plans to add 3,000 seats inside the Vines Center.

Directly following the Flames final home against VMI on Nov. 7, 2009, Liberty began to renovate Williams Stadium, marking the first major expansion to the Flames home for football since the stadium was completed in 1989.

The first of a three-phase plan calls for the addition of 6,600 seats added to the west side of the stadium, plus a 34,000-square foot press box. The brick and glass encased, Jeffersonian-style four-story tower will house club-level seating for qualified Flames Club donors, 18 permanent luxury suites, a banquet room which can hold up to 500 people, a 1,000-seat classroom and a state-of-the-art press area.

"The expansion of Williams Stadium will have a monumental effect on Liberty University and its football program," stated Jeff Barber, Liberty's Director of Athletics. "Above all else, this shows a great commitment from the University, and when you have a commitment, a lot of wonderful things can happen."

Phase One of the plan is part of a multiphase effort to boost the stadium's seating from its current capacity of 12,000 to 30,000 over the next five years. Phases Two and Three will add a new 4,000-seat middeck for the east side of the stadium and 6,400 seats in a horseshoe-shape area surrounding the end zone in the south end of the stadium.

When all three phases are complete, the stadium will have undergone an estimated \$22 million in improvements. The renovated facility will also ready the stadium for the future construction of upper decks on the west and east sides of the stadium that will bring the capacity to 60,000.

"You cannot ignore the importance of facilities in recruiting. Kids always look for nicer facilities and to be a part of a team where they feel the program is an important overall part of the University," stated Liberty Head Football Coach Danny Rocco. "Above all, I think it just shows a great commitment from our University's administration to get our program to a level of national prominence."

Falwell said the Williams Stadium expansion is keeping up with Liberty's overall growth pattern. Fall enrollment for residential studies this year is expected to reach 12,200. Liberty had just over 5,000 on-campus students just 11 years ago.

"This stadium project is a natural step for Liberty in its progression from a small Bible college to a major university," added Falwell. "That was the goal from the beginning – to be for evangelical young people what Notre Dame is to the Catholics and what Brigham Young is to the Mormons. Athletics, and football in particular, was always a big part in that vision."

"Prospective student-athletes will see Liberty as a serious contender in NCAA Division I athletics," continued Falwell. "We'll be able to better recruit the top student-athletes in every sport. Improvements like this will help us convey the message that Liberty is achieving excellence in academics and in all of our facilities and programs. I think this will provide a major boost in both our athletics and academic recruiting. My father always said, 'If it's Christian, it ought to be better.'"

Game No. 1 - N.C. State 43, No. 22/18 Liberty 21

Sept. 3, 2011 - Raleigh, N.C. - Carter-Finley Stadium (56,564)

No. 22/18 Liberty committed seven turnovers, including two during the final five minutes of the game, which broke open a close contest with N.C. State. The last two giveaways led to the Wolfpack's final 13 points in a 43-21 win over Liberty inside of Carter-Finley Stadium.

The loss is only the second season-opening setback for the Flames during the six-year tenure of head coach Danny Rocco. The first was a 33-20 loss to the BIG EAST's West Virginia to open up the 2009 campaign.

Nearly 15 minutes of football went by before either team could put a dent in the scoreboard, as N.C. State took its first lead of the evening on a 32-yard field goal by Niklas Sade.

The two teams traded a pair of possessions before the Wolfpack mounted an 11-play, 64-yard scoring drive that gave Sade, a true freshman, his first collegiate field goal.

The drive nearly started 20 yards back, as a punt by Mike Larsson was almost downed at the N.C. State one-yard line. However, the ball just trickled into the end zone to give N.C. State possession at its own 20-yard line.

Five-straight rushing plays led to four completions in a row by N.C. State quarterback Mike Glennon. A fifth-consecutive try was unsuccessful when Glennon was flushed from the pocket and had to hurry an attempt to Jay Smith to set up the field goal.

A pair of miscues early in the second quarter led to some excitement and the first Liberty lead of the evening.

A high snap to Mike Brown led to a loose ball, as the ball was stripped from Liberty's senior quarterback by Darryl Cato-Bishop and picked up by Audie Cole at the N.C. State 38-yard line.

However, Liberty quickly returned the favor and sacked Glennon on the next play. The tackle by Walt Aikens jarred the ball loose and Francis Bah picked up the free ball and returned it 32 yards to give Liberty a 7-3 edge with 13:30 left in the opening half.

The score remained the same for the next 10 minutes until an 82-yard punt return by T.J. Graham gave N.C. State a 9-7 lead with 3:38 remaining until halftime.

Liberty was forced to punt on a fourth-and-12 play at its own 35-yard line. Larsson's

punt skipped over Graham's head and the senior only gained five yards before being tackled.

However, the Wolfpack were called for holding on the play and the Flames elected to retry the punt to attempt to pin N.C. State inside its 20-yard line.

Graham then took advantage of the extra opportunity, as the senior fielded the ball and quickly got to the outside. After getting one last key block around midfield, the senior found the end zone for his second career punt return and the 11th-longest in N.C. State history.

A penalty was called on the point after attempt and Sade did not find the extra chance to his liking, as the freshman missed to the right to keep the score 9-7.

Another Liberty turnover allowed the Wolfpack to extend their lead to 16-7 going into the locker room at halftime.

Following a 39-yard kickoff return by Kevin Fogg, Liberty started with possession at the N.C. State 47-yard line. After a two-yard rushing gain by Sirchauncey Holloway, Brown's attempted pass over the middle was intercepted by D.J. Green to give the home team the ball back.

Following two lengthy passing plays by Glennon, Liberty nearly made a goal line stand. But a second effort by James Washington gave the junior halfback a one-yard touchdown score, capping off a quick 10-play, 57-yard drive to extend N.C. State's margin to nine with 32 seconds left before the halftime break.

The third turnover of the game by Brown led to N.C. State's first touchdown of the second half. Trying to reach the first-down marker on a second-and-seven play, Brown was stopped one yard short by Earl Wolff. While the safety was bringing Brown to the ground, he stripped the ball loose. Brian Slay recovered the miscue and returned it 52 yards for a score. The fourth-longest fumble return in Wolfpack history pushed N.C. State's lead to 23-7 at the 8:51 mark of the third quarter.

Following a 24-yard return by Korrey Davis, Brown got to the outside for a 21-yard burst. N.C. State was whistled for a late hit out of bounds, giving the Flames the ball at the 27-yard line.

The Walter Payton candidate connection of Brown and Chris Summers then found each other for the first time in 2011. Brown lofted a ball into the end zone 27 yards downfield, giving Summers his 20th career touchdown. Following a short pass from Brown to Pat Kelly in the back left corner of the end zone, the two-point conversion pulled the Flames within eight, 23-15, 25 seconds later.

Big plays continue to lead to scoring efforts, this time benefiting the homestanding Wolfpack. After a 44-yard kickoff return by Graham that started N.C. State at Liberty's 33-yard line, Curtis Underwood scored two plays later on a 33-yard run to give the Wolfpack a 15-point edge, 30-15, just 10 seconds after Liberty's score.

The Flames pieced together an eight-play, 40-yard scoring drive to pull back within 12 points, 30-18, following a 50-yard field goal by two-time All-America kicker Matt Bevins. The 50-yard boot was the fourth 50-plus yard field goal of the senior's career.

After Liberty forced a three-and-out series, the Flames continued to chip away at N.C. State's advantage. Another eight-play drive stalled at the 21-yard line when Aldreakis Allen was stopped on an attempted run on a third-and-three play.

Liberty was forced to settle for Bevins' second field goal of the second half, a 38-yarder, trimming the lead to nine, 30-21, just 39 seconds into the final quarter. The three-pointer was his school-record 56th of his career.

Six minutes later, Rocco challenged a call and got the initial ruling on the field overturned, giving the Flames the ball back after a fumble by Underwood at the N.C. State 32-yard line.

However, Brown fumbled on the very next play when he was struck by Jeff Rieskamp and the loose football was scooped up by Slay with 7:40 left to play.

During the remaining minutes of the contest, N.C. State scored twice, once on a Glennon pass to Mario Carter and the second on a 19-yard rushing touchdown by Washington. Washington's second score of the night was set up by an interception, when David Amerson picked off Brown for the third and final time of the night.

Game No. 2 - No. 24/21 Liberty 38, Robert Morris 7

Sept. 10, 2011 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (15,805)

Four sacks and three interceptions set the tone for No. 24/21 Liberty's 38-7 home-opening victory over Robert Morris, inside of Williams Stadium.

The two teams used most of the first quarter to feel each other out, as the game remained scoreless through the first nine minutes.

Liberty had excellent starting position for its second drive of the game, thanks to a 30-yard punt return by B.J. Hayes. The Big South preseason all-conference punt returner fielded the Tony LaMancusa punt at the Robert Morris 42-yard line and found a seam down the middle of the field to get to the Robert Morris 12-yard line.

Following a seven-yard gain by Sirchauncey Holloway, Walter Payton Award candidate Mike Brown called his own number. The senior quickly got to the outside to score his 21st career rushing touchdown, giving Liberty a 7-0 lead after a five-yard run.

The Flames doubled their lead during the closing minutes of the opening quarter, thanks to a two-player connection.

Liberty managed to quickly march downfield, scoring on a six-play, 85-yard drive that took just 1:43 off the clock. Four of the six plays were pass completions from Brown to Pat Kelly, including the scoring dart, a 39-yard lofted ball into the corner of the zone.

The second quarter was dominated by both team's defensive units, with the two teams combining for 89 total offensive yards during the second 15-minutes of the game.

The lone legitimate scoring chance either squad had during the period came late, as Liberty penetrated the Colonials 20-yard line shortly after Kevin Fogg picked off a Jeff Sinclair pass.

However, Holloway gave the ball back four plays later, when it came loose on a run up the middle and was recovered by Sam Miller at the Robert Morris 15-yard line.

Robert Morris had more chances to advance the ball during the first half, finishing the opening 30 minutes of the game with 34 plays to Liberty's 30 plays. But the Flames made the most of their chances, more than doubling the Colonials with a 193 to 81 total offensive yard edge.

Brown was once again Liberty's top offensive weapon, accounting for 167 of

Liberty's 193 total offensive yards. Brown carried the ball eight times for 29 yards and a score, while completing 10-of-14 passing attempts for 138 yards and a scoring pass.

Kelly was Brown's top target, finishing the first half with four catches for 75 yards, which all came on the last scoring drive of the opening half.

Robert Morris was paced by Justin Brooks and Sinclair during the first half. Brooks rushed 10 times for 30 yards, while Sinclair completed 6-of-13 passing attempts.

The story of the third quarter was a pair of interceptions during the 15-minute span that allowed the Flames to increase their lead by 14 points.

Fogg became the first player since the 2004 season to intercept two passes in one game, when he stepped in front of a Sinclair pass and returned it 11 yards to the Robert Morris four-yard line. The last player to accomplish the same feat was Jordan Alford against Elon during the closing game of the year on Nov. 20.

Two plays later, Brown scored from one yard out, but the play was negated after a Liberty holding penalty. The flag only delayed Brown's second rushing touchdown of the game, as the quarterback carried the ball on each of the next two plays, including a seven-yard scamper at 8:21 to push Liberty's lead to 21-0.

Robert Morris managed to cross the 50-yard line for the first time on the night during the ensuing drive, only to give it away six plays later.

The Colonials looked like they were piecing together their first scoring effort of the night, getting to the Liberty 33-yard line. However, Walt Aikens intercepted a pass at the 29-yard line, Sinclair's third thrown interception of the night, to give the Flames the ball back.

Liberty used exactly 120 seconds on the next drive, marching 65 yards downfield on six plays to push its lead to 28-0 at the 1:50 mark.

Two deep passing plays spotlighted the driving effort. The first was slant to Chris Summers, with Liberty's other Walter Payton Award candidate catching a 26-yard strike in double coverage.

Four plays later, Brown was able to avoid the Robert Morris pass rush and found Ryan Ferguson open in the end zone for his first collegiate touchdown on a 37-yard passing play.

The Colonials finally cracked the scoreboard during their opening drive of the fourth quarter, piecing together their longest drive of the day of 12 plays and 67 yards.

The scoring push was capped off by a nine-yard passing strike to Vince Mongeluzzo at the 10:25 mark.

Liberty quickly answered back and sealed the victory, when Fogg returned the ensuing kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown, giving the Flames their first special teams score of the 2011 season.

Matt Bevins capped off the night with a 23-yard field goal at the 2:17 mark, his 16th-straight field goal and the 57th of his career.

Liberty outgained Robert Morris on the night with 355 total offensive yards to the visitor's 234, despite the Colonials finishing the night with 69 total plays to the Flames 56.

Brown had his 13th-straight 200-plus total offensive yard game, as the senior finished with 252 yards. The quarterback led the Flames rushing effort with 11 carries for 43 yards, while completing 13-of-22 passing plays for 209 yards.

Brown played a part in all four of Liberty's offensive touchdowns, throwing for two and rushing for two more.

Kelly led all Liberty receivers with his four first-half catches for 75 yards. Summers and Ferguson each finished the night with identical numbers, hauling in three passes for 55 yards.

Brooks led the Colonials with 22 rushing attempts for 86 yards, while Sinclair finished the night 12-of-26 passing for 105 yards, three interceptions and a touchdown pass.

Liberty's defensive leader on the night was Brent Vinson, who tied a career high with eight tackles, including 1.5 sacks for a loss of 19 total yards.

KaJuan Lee also tied a career high, matching his seven-tackle effort against Gardner-Webb in 2009 with the same number of stops.
