Today's Game

For the second week in a row, the Flames find themselves in the middle of a Top 25 FCS match-up, when No. 23 Liberty travels to Bethlehem, Pa., to face No. 15/16 Lehigh in an afternoon game inside of Goodman Stadium.

Second Time Around

Saturday afternoon's game between Liberty and Lehigh will be the second in the all-time series and the first in Bethlehem, Pa. During the first meeting, the Mountain Hawks scored on their opening possession of the second to open up a close battle, en route to a 34-16 victory inside of Williams Stadium on Sept. 18, 2004.

Five Times the Fun

Next week's FCS Top 25 polls could look quite differently, following a weekend that includes five match-ups between pairs of nationally ranked teams. Liberty and Lehigh are among the group, with the Mountain Hawks coming in ranked No. 15 in the Sports Network poll and No. 16 in the FCS Coaches poll. Liberty is ranked No. 23 in the FCS Coaches poll and the first team outside the Sports Network Top 25 listing this week.

Looking for No. 200

The Flames enter Saturday's match-up with Lehigh with an overall program record of 199-199-4 in 39 years of gridiron action, meaning a win over the Mountain Hawks inside of Goodman Stadium this weekend would be the program's 200th overall victory.

Singing the Same Tune

Fans who enter Goodman Stadium this weekend in Bethlehem, Pa., will most likely see an "air show" on Saturday when two of the top passing offenses in the country collide. Lehigh comes into the match-up ranked No. 3 in the country by averaging 377.00 passing yards per game, while Liberty ranks No. 17 by passing for an average of 275.33 yards per contest. The Mountain Hawks also lead the country with 14 passing touchdowns through three games in 2011.

Their Best Against Ours

The strength of Liberty's defense will go up against the power of Lehigh's offense and only 60 minutes of gridiron play will tell who will be the victor.

Lehigh ranks No. 3 in the country in passing offense by averaging 377.00 passing yards per game, while the Mountain Hawks lead all FCS programs with 14 passing touchdowns.

Liberty currently ranks No. 15 in the country in passing defense, allowing 138.00 passing yards per game, while having surrendered just two passing touchdowns in three games.

Liberty also ranks No. 21 in total defense, as the Flames are allowing 288.67 total offensive yards per game. The figure is nearly half of the total offensive yards that Lehigh is averaging this season (507.0 total offensive yards per game/ranks No. 4 nationally).

Last Time Against - No. 24 Lehigh 34, Liberty 16

Sept. 18, 2004 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (10,895)

The Mountain Hawks scored a touch-down on the first drive of the second half and controlled the pace of play the remainder of the game as No. 24 Lehigh handed the Flames a 34-16 loss at Williams Stadium.

The first half of the contest was dominated by both teams' defenses. A pair of second quarter touchdowns marked the only scoring in the first half as the two teams combined for just 387 combined yards of total offense.

Lehigh looked like it was going to score on the opening drive of the game as three rushing attempts by Eric Rath and a 3-for-3 passing performance by Mark Borda got the Mountain Hawks down to the Flames' 20-yard line. However, Borda's pass to the end zone was picked off by Erick Harris to start a great defensive battle.

The score remained tied until Liberty's first drive of the second quarter. Eugene Goodman carried the ball nine times on the 12-play drive, including a one-yard run for a touchdown at the 8:25 mark to give the Flames a 6-0 lead as the centered ball on the extra point attempt was mishandled.

However, the Mountain Hawks quickly answered back as Rath broke free for a 50-yard rush midway through the drive to set up a reverse by Kevin Zebulum on a 17-yard rushing touchdown over two minutes later. The score remained the same during the rest of the first half, giving Lehigh a 7-6 edge heading into the locker room at halftime.

The run game was the weapon of choice for both programs during the opening 30 minute of play. The two teams combined for 387 total offensive yards during the first half, with 276 of those yards coming via the ground game (71.3 percent).

Both team had 100-yard rushers by half-time. Goodman paced the Flames, carrying the ball 18 times for 103 yards, while Rath rushed for 118 yards on his 14 carries.

Paul Troth completed 5-of-7 passing attempts for 50 yards, while Borda was efficient by completing 7-of-10 attempts for 61 yards.

The Flames took possession of the ball on the first drive of the third quarter; however, they were forced to punt after a three-and-out series.

The tandem of Rath and Borda led the Mountain Hawks down the field on their first drive of the third quarter with Rath capping off the 11-play, 63-yard drive with a three-yard option toss from Borda for a touchdown with 7:19 left to play in the third quarter.

The Flames would fail to get a first down on their next five possessions, while turning the ball over twice on interceptions, including one which was returned for a touchdown by Kaloma Cardwell just 21 seconds into the fourth quarter.

The Mountain Hawks added to their lead with two fourth quarter passing touchdowns by Borda.

The quarterback hooked up with Adam Kovacs for a 13-yard score with 8:44 left and a three-yard slant to Adam Bergen with 6:30 left on the clock to give Lehigh a 34-8 lead.

The Flames attempted to make the game interesting as back-up quarterback Travis Johnson called his own number on an 18-yard rushing attempt down the sideline with 1:34 left to play.

After recovering the ensuing onside kick, Liberty failed to score on the drive as the Flames were stopped on the Lehigh four-yard line as the clock expired.

Lehigh, whose defense came into the game ranked No. 5 in the nation in rushing defense, held the Flames' prolific rushing attack to just 170 yards, including 23 yards in the decisive third quarter.

During the decisive second half of the contest, the Flames were limited to just 46 total yards gained on the ground.

The two teams finished with comparable total offensive yards as Lehigh gained 363 yards to Liberty's 346 yards.

Rath led all running backs with 144 yards gained on 23 carries, including one scoring run.

Goodman led the Flames with 142 yards and a touchdown, marking his sixth-consecutive 100-yard game to set a new school record for consecutive 100-yard rushing performances.

Borda led the Mountain Hawks' passing attack as he completed 20-of-27 attempts for 156 yards and two touchdowns.

Liberty's Paul Troth was held to just 54 yards on 6-of-14 passing, while being picked off three times before Johnson finished the game with 122 yards on 10-of-17 passing late in the contest.

C.J. Moore posted his third-consecutive double-figure tackle performance as Liberty's starting free safety led all defenders in the game with 15 tackles, including eight solo stops, while Nick Vaughn followed with 10 tackles.

The Mountain Hawks were paced defensively by Neal Boozer-Gallman, who finished with 12 tackles, while Andrew Nelson and Cardwell each posted 10 stops.

Flames Flashbacks

News and Notes about Liberty's recent Match-Up with James Madison

- The loss to James Madison ended Liberty's nine-game home winning streak, which was the fourth-longest active home FCS winning streak in the country coming into the game.
- The game was played in front of 18,878 fans, marking the second-largest crowd in Williams Stadium history.
- The loss marked Liberty's third-straight defeat to a Top 25 ranked program, with all three setbacks coming against James Madison in the last three seasons.
- With the loss to No. 13/14 James Madison, the Flames fall to 3-4 all-time under head coach Danny Rocco in match-ups against Top 25 ranked programs.
- The loss denied the Flames the football program's 200th victory, leveling Liberty's all-time record at 199-199-1 since the program's first game in 1972.
- Liberty did manage to score 24 points against No. 13/14 James Madison, which was a marked improvement after the Flames had combined for 33 points in five previous meetings against the Dukes (all five meetings coming since the series was restarted in 2000).
- The loss marked only the fifth home setback for the Flames during the six-year tenure of head coach Danny Rocco (Liberty is now 26-5 all-time in home games under Coach Rocco).
- Liberty was limited to 74 team rushing yards against James Madison, marking just the eighth time in 59 games under head coach Danny Rocco the Flames have failed to record at least 100 rushing yards in a game.
- The Flames missed having their seventh 300-passing yard performance under head coach Danny Rocco by two yards, with Liberty finishing the night with 298 team passing yards.
- For the 51st time in 59 games under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames surpassed the 300 total offensive yard mark, as Liberty finished the James Madison match-up with 372 yards.
- James Madison and Liberty finished the game with exactly 17 first downs each.
- James Madison finished with 10 out of 17 first downs coming on rushing plays, while Liberty had 10 of its 17 first downs come via the passing game.
- James Madison became the 14th opposing team in 59 games under head coach Danny Rocco to score three or more rushing touchdowns in a game.
- The Flames made the most of their passing attack against James Madison, finishing the game 24-of-29 passing for 298 yards.
- Liberty averaged 10.3 yards per reception against James Madison.
- Liberty finished the game with two passing touchdowns, marking the 30th time under head coach Danny Rocco Liberty has passed for at least two touchdowns in a game.
- Liberty was flagged during the game for a season-high 11 penalties for 120 total penalty yards.
- The James Madison game marked the sixth time under head coach Danny Rocco the Flames have finished a game with 10 or more penalties (highest was 13 twice, games in 2007 and 2008).
- The James Madison game marked the fifth time under head coach Danny Rocco the Flames have finished a game with 100 or more total penalty yards (highest was 136 against North Greenville to open the season in 2008).
- Liberty was only forced to punt once against James Madison, a 59-yard punt by Mike Larsson that pinned the Dukes deep in their own territory.
- After committing seven turnovers during the season opener against N.C. State, Liberty finished its second game in a row with just a single turnover.
- The second-straight game, the Flames lost the time of possession battle, as James Madison finished the game with a 31:27 to 28:33 TOP edge.
- Liberty finished the game against James Madison 7-of-10 on third-down conversion, after coming into the game 12-of-27 during the first two games of the year.
- The Flames scored 14 of their 24 points against James Madison during the third quarter of the game.
- Liberty has now scored 39 points during the third quarter in games played in 2011, while scoring a combined 44 points in the other three remaining periods (1st - 14, 2nd - 10, 4th - 20).

Mike Brown (R-Sr., QB)

- Mike Brown finished his 14th-straight game with 200 or more total offensive yards, posting 333 total offensive yards against James Madison.
- For the second time this year and the 10th time in his career, Mike Brown finished a game with 300 or more total offensive yards.
- Mike Brown factored into all three of Liberty's touchdowns against James Madison, throwing for two and rushing for another.
- Mike Brown finished the James Madison game completing 24-of-29 passes for 298 yards, missing out on the fourth 300-yard passing game of his career by two yards.
- Mike Brown accounted for 89.5 percent of Liberty's total offensive yards against James Madison, finished with 333 of the team's 372 total offensive yards against the Dukes.
- On the season, Mike Brown has accounted for 83.1 percent of Liberty's total offensive yards through the first three games of the season (941-of-1,133 total offensive yards).
- Mike Brown currently ranks No. 7 nationally in total offense, averaging 313.67 total offensive yards per game.
- Mike Brown currently ranks No. 11 nationally in points responsible for, averaging 17.33 points per game.
- Mike Brown passed for 298 yards against James Madison, pushing him past the 4,000 career passing yard mark (4,194 yards).

On Aug. 28, 2009, during Liberty University's convocation service, Chancellor Jerry Falwell, Jr., announced plans for extensive stadium expansion at Williams Stadium and in the Vines Center, which will put Liberty's athletics facilities on par with those at the highest level of NCAA competition.

"I think these projects will take us to a higher level of competition," Falwell said. "It will put Liberty on the same level as other major universities in the state and in the region. I think it is amazing what we are accomplishing with God's help. The sky's the limit for Liberty."

Before a packed house inside the Vines Center, Falwell unveiled plans to increase Williams Stadium seating to 19,200 by the opening of the 2010 season, plus plans to add 3,000 seats inside the Vines Center.

Directly following the Flames final home against VMI on Nov. 7, 2009, Liberty began to renovate Williams Stadium, marking the first major expansion to the Flames home for football since the stadium was completed in 1989.

The first of a three-phase plan calls for the addition of 6,600 seats added to the west side of the stadium, plus a 34,000-square foot press box. The brick and glass encased, Jeffersonian-style four-story tower will house club-level seating for qualified Flames Club donors, 18 permanent luxury suites, a banquet room which can hold up to 500 people, a 1,000-seat classroom and a state-of-the-art press area.

"The expansion of Williams Stadium will have a monumental effect on Liberty University and its football program," stated Jeff Barber, Liberty's Director of Athletics. "Above all else, this shows a great commitment from the University, and when you have a commitment, a lot of wonderful things can happen."

Phase One of the plan is part of a multiphase effort to boost the stadium's seating from its current capacity of 12,000 to 30,000 over the next five years. Phases Two and Three will add a new 4,000-seat middeck for the east side of the stadium and 6,400 seats in a horseshoe-shape area surrounding the end zone in the south end of the stadium.

When all three phases are complete, the stadium will have undergone an estimated \$22 million in improvements. The renovated facility will also ready the stadium for the future construction of upper decks on the west and east sides of the stadium that will bring the capacity to 60,000.

"You cannot ignore the importance of facilities in recruiting. Kids always look for nicer facilities and to be a part of a team where they feel the program is an important overall part of the University," stated Liberty Head Football Coach Danny Rocco. "Above all, I think it just shows a great commitment from our University's administration to get our program to a level of national prominence."

Falwell said the Williams Stadium expansion is keeping up with Liberty's overall growth pattern. Fall enrollment for residential studies this year is expected to reach 12,200. Liberty had just over 5,000 on-campus students just 11 years ago.

"This stadium project is a natural step for Liberty in its progression from a small Bible college to a major university," added Falwell. "That was the goal from the beginning – to be for evangelical young people what Notre Dame is to the Catholics and what Brigham Young is to the Mormons. Athletics, and football in particular, was always a big part in that vision."

"Prospective student-athletes will see Liberty as a serious contender in NCAA Division I athletics," continued Falwell. "We'll be able to better recruit the top student-athletes in every sport. Improvements like this will help us convey the message that Liberty is achieving excellence in academics and in all of our facilities and programs. I think this will provide a major boost in both our athletics and academic recruiting. My father always said, 'If it's Christian, it ought to be better.'"

Game No. 1 - N.C. State 43, No. 22/18 Liberty 21

Sept. 3, 2011 - Raleigh, N.C. - Carter-Finley Stadium (56,564)

No. 22/18 Liberty committed seven turnovers, including two during the final five minutes of the game, which broke open a close contest with N.C. State. The last two giveaways led to the Wolfpack's final 13 points in a 43-21 win over Liberty inside of Carter-Finley Stadium.

The loss is only the second season-opening setback for the Flames during the six-year tenure of head coach Danny Rocco. The first was a 33-20 loss to the BIG EAST's West Virginia to open up the 2009 campaign.

Nearly 15 minutes of football went by before either team could put a dent in the scoreboard, as N.C. State took its first lead of the evening on a 32-yard field goal by Niklas Sade.

The two teams traded a pair of possessions before the Wolfpack mounted an 11-play, 64-yard scoring drive that gave Sade, a true freshman, his first collegiate field goal.

The drive nearly started 20 yards back, as a punt by Mike Larsson was almost downed at the N.C. State one-yard line. However, the ball just trickled into the end zone to give N.C. State possession at its own 20-yard line.

Five-straight rushing plays led to four completions in a row by N.C. State quarterback Mike Glennon. A fifth-consecutive try was unsuccessful when Glennon was flushed from the pocket and had to hurry an attempt to Jay Smith to set up the field goal.

A pair of miscues early in the second quarter led to some excitement and the first Liberty lead of the evening.

A high snap to Mike Brown led to a loose ball, as the ball was stripped from Liberty's senior quarterback by Darryl Cato-Bishop and picked up by Audie Cole at the N.C. State 38-yard line.

However, Liberty quickly returned the favor and sacked Glennon on the next play. The tackle by Walt Aikens jarred the ball loose and Francis Bah picked up the free ball and returned it 32 yards to give Liberty a 7-3 edge with 13:30 left in the opening half.

The score remained the same for the next 10 minutes until an 82-yard punt return by T.J. Graham gave N.C. State a 9-7 lead with 3:38 remaining until halftime.

Liberty was forced to punt on a fourth-and-12 play at its own 35-yard line. Larsson's

punt skipped over Graham's head and the senior only gained five yards before being tackled.

However, the Wolfpack were called for holding on the play and the Flames elected to retry the punt to attempt to pin N.C. State inside its 20-yard line.

Graham then took advantage of the extra opportunity, as the senior fielded the ball and quickly got to the outside. After getting one last key block around midfield, the senior found the end zone for his second career punt return and the 11th-longest in N.C. State history.

A penalty was called on the point after attempt and Sade did not find the extra chance to his liking, as the freshman missed to the right to keep the score 9-7.

Another Liberty turnover allowed the Wolfpack to extend their lead to 16-7 going into the locker room at halftime.

Following a 39-yard kickoff return by Kevin Fogg, Liberty started with possession at the N.C. State 47-yard line. After a two-yard rushing gain by Sirchauncey Holloway, Brown's attempted pass over the middle was intercepted by D.J. Green to give the home team the ball back.

Following two lengthy passing plays by Glennon, Liberty nearly made a goal line stand. But a second effort by James Washington gave the junior halfback a one-yard touchdown score, capping off a quick 10-play, 57-yard drive to extend N.C. State's margin to nine with 32 seconds left before the halftime break.

The third turnover of the game by Brown led to N.C. State's first touchdown of the second half. Trying to reach the first-down marker on a second-and-seven play, Brown was stopped one yard short by Earl Wolff. While the safety was bringing Brown to the ground, he stripped the ball loose. Brian Slay recovered the miscue and returned it 52 yards for a score. The fourth-longest fumble return in Wolfpack history pushed N.C. State's lead to 23-7 at the 8:51 mark of the third quarter.

Following a 24-yard return by Korrey Davis, Brown got to the outside for a 21-yard burst. N.C. State was whistled for a late hit out of bounds, giving the Flames the ball at the 27-yard line.

The Walter Payton candidate connection of Brown and Chris Summers then found each other for the first time in 2011. Brown lofted a ball into the end zone 27 yards downfield, giving Summers his 20th career touchdown. Following a short pass from Brown to Pat Kelly in the back left corner of the end zone, the two-point conversion pulled the Flames within eight, 23-15, 25 seconds later.

Big plays continue to lead to scoring efforts, this time benefiting the homestanding Wolfpack. After a 44-yard kickoff return by Graham that started N.C. State at Liberty's 33-yard line, Curtis Underwood scored two plays later on a 33-yard run to give the Wolfpack a 15-point edge, 30-15, just 10 seconds after Liberty's score.

The Flames pieced together an eight-play, 40-yard scoring drive to pull back within 12 points, 30-18, following a 50-yard field goal by two-time All-America kicker Matt Bevins. The 50-yard boot was the fourth 50-plus yard field goal of the senior's career.

After Liberty forced a three-and-out series, the Flames continued to chip away at N.C. State's advantage. Another eight-play drive stalled at the 21-yard line when Aldreakis Allen was stopped on an attempted run on a third-and-three play.

Liberty was forced to settle for Bevins' second field goal of the second half, a 38-yarder, trimming the lead to nine, 30-21, just 39 seconds into the final quarter. The three-pointer was his school-record 56th of his career.

Six minutes later, Rocco challenged a call and got the initial ruling on the field overturned, giving the Flames the ball back after a fumble by Underwood at the N.C. State 32-yard line.

However, Brown fumbled on the very next play when he was struck by Jeff Rieskamp and the loose football was scooped up by Slay with 7:40 left to play.

During the remaining minutes of the contest, N.C. State scored twice, once on a Glennon pass to Mario Carter and the second on a 19-yard rushing touchdown by Washington. Washington's second score of the night was set up by an interception, when David Amerson picked off Brown for the third and final time of the night.

Four sacks and three interceptions set the tone for No. 24/21 Liberty's 38-7 home-opening victory over Robert Morris, inside of Williams Stadium.

The two teams used most of the first quarter to feel each other out, as the game remained scoreless through the first nine minutes.

Liberty had excellent starting position for its second drive of the game, thanks to a 30-yard punt return by B.J. Hayes. The Big South preseason all-conference punt returner fielded the Tony LaMancusa punt at the Robert Morris 42-yard line and found a seam down the middle of the field to get to the Robert Morris 12-yard line.

Following a seven-yard gain by Sirchauncey Holloway, Walter Payton Award candidate Mike Brown called his own number. The senior quickly got to the outside to score his 21st career rushing touchdown, giving Liberty a 7-0 lead after a five-yard run.

The Flames doubled their lead during the closing minutes of the opening quarter, thanks to a two-player connection.

Liberty managed to quickly march downfield, scoring on a six-play, 85-yard drive that took just 1:43 off the clock. Four of the six plays were pass completions from Brown to Pat Kelly, including the scoring dart, a 39-yard lofted ball into the corner of the zone.

The second quarter was dominated by both team's defensive units, with the two teams combining for 89 total offensive yards during the second 15-minutes of the game.

The lone legitimate scoring chance either squad had during the period came late, as Liberty penetrated the Colonials 20-yard line shortly after Kevin Fogg picked off a Jeff Sinclair pass.

However, Holloway gave the ball back four plays later, when it came loose on a run up the middle and was recovered by Sam Miller at the Robert Morris 15-yard line.

Robert Morris had more chances to advance the ball during the first half, finishing the opening 30 minutes of the game with 34 plays to Liberty's 30 plays. But the Flames made the most of their chances, more than doubling the Colonials with a 193 to 81 total offensive yard edge.

Brown was once again Liberty's top offensive weapon, accounting for 167 of

Liberty's 193 total offensive yards. Brown carried the ball eight times for 29 yards and a score, while completing 10-of-14 passing attempts for 138 yards and a scoring pass.

Kelly was Brown's top target, finishing the first half with four catches for 75 yards, which all came on the last scoring drive of the opening half.

Robert Morris was paced by Justin Brooks and Sinclair during the first half. Brooks rushed 10 times for 30 yards, while Sinclair completed 6-of-13 passing attempts.

The story of the third quarter was a pair of interceptions during the 15-minute span that allowed the Flames to increase their lead by 14 points.

Fogg became the first player since the 2004 season to intercept two passes in one game, when he stepped in front of a Sinclair pass and returned it 11 yards to the Robert Morris four-yard line. The last player to accomplish the same feat was Jordan Alford against Elon during the closing game of the year on Nov. 20.

Two plays later, Brown scored from one yard out, but the play was negated after a Liberty holding penalty. The flag only delayed Brown's second rushing touchdown of the game, as the quarterback carried the ball on each of the next two plays, including a seven-yard scamper at 8:21 to push Liberty's lead to 21-0.

Robert Morris managed to cross the 50-yard line for the first time on the night during the ensuing drive, only to give it away six plays later.

The Colonials looked like they were piecing together their first scoring effort of the night, getting to the Liberty 33-yard line. However, Walt Aikens intercepted a pass at the 29-yard line, Sinclair's third thrown interception of the night, to give the Flames the ball back.

Liberty used exactly 120 seconds on the next drive, marching 65 yards downfield on six plays to push its lead to 28-0 at the 1:50 mark.

Two deep passing plays spotlighted the driving effort. The first was slant to Chris Summers, with Liberty's other Walter Payton Award candidate catching a 26-yard strike in double coverage.

Four plays later, Brown was able to avoid the Robert Morris pass rush and found Ryan Ferguson open in the end zone for his first collegiate touchdown on a 37-yard passing play.

The Colonials finally cracked the scoreboard during their opening drive of the fourth quarter, piecing together their longest drive of the day of 12 plays and 67 yards.

The scoring push was capped off by a nine-yard passing strike to Vince Mongeluzzo at the 10:25 mark.

Liberty quickly answered back and sealed the victory, when Fogg returned the ensuing kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown, giving the Flames their first special teams score of the 2011 season.

Matt Bevins capped off the night with a 23-yard field goal at the 2:17 mark, his 16th-straight field goal and the 57th of his career.

Liberty outgained Robert Morris on the night with 355 total offensive yards to the visitor's 234, despite the Colonials finishing the night with 69 total plays to the Flames 56.

Brown had his 13th-straight 200-plus total offensive yard game, as the senior finished with 252 yards. The quarterback led the Flames rushing effort with 11 carries for 43 yards, while completing 13-of-22 passing plays for 209 yards.

Brown played a part in all four of Liberty's offensive touchdowns, throwing for two and rushing for two more.

Kelly led all Liberty receivers with his four first-half catches for 75 yards. Summers and Ferguson each finished the night with identical numbers, hauling in three passes for 55 yards.

Brooks led the Colonials with 22 rushing attempts for 86 yards, while Sinclair finished the night 12-of-26 passing for 105 yards, three interceptions and a touchdown pass.

Liberty's defensive leader on the night was Brent Vinson, who tied a career high with eight tackles, including 1.5 sacks for a loss of 19 total yards.

KaJuan Lee also tied a career high, matching his seven-tackle effort against Gardner-Webb in 2009 with the same number of stops.

Sept. 17, 2011 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (18,878)

A low-scoring first half turned into a second-half shootout that ended on a game-winning field goal by Cameron Starke, lifting No. 13/14 James Madison to a 27-24 victory over No. 22/20 Liberty inside Williams Stadium.

Big plays helped the visiting Dukes get on the scoreboard first, with James Madison scoring quickly on its opening drive of the game. Jordan Anderson opened the contest with a 32-yard kickoff return, thanks to the sophomore finding a hole late during the return.

Two 24-yard plays during the seven-play, 55-yard scoring drive keyed the opening push by the James Madison offense. The first was a 24-yard pass play from Justin Thorpe to Renard Robinson and the second was a 24-yard rushing effort by Dae'Quan Scott to get inside the red zone.

Scott kept the ball on the next two plays, including a three-yard scoring burst up the middle, giving James Madison a 7-0 edge at 11:30.

Sizeable gains continued to be the theme of the first half and the largest of the opening 30 minutes of the game for Liberty seemed to get the Flames into scoring position. On the first play of the second quarter, Mike Brown rolled out and hit B.J. Hayes open in the flat and the senior scampered 60 yards down the field before he was pushed out of bounds.

The longest reception in Hayes' career got Liberty down to the 10-yard line; however, Brown was sacked for a three-yard loss and the Flames were whistled for a 15-yard unsportsmanlike conduct penalty.

The negative-yardage stop and the flag pushed the Flames back to the 36-yard line, where Matt Bevins missed his second 43-yard field goal attempt on the night. The first, which took place during the middle of the first quarter, snapped a string of 16-straight successful field goal attempts.

The Dukes responded and pieced together their longest scoring drive of the night, when Cameron Starke connected on a 32-yard field goal with 5:07 left on the opening half clock. The boot capped off a 14-play, 7:50-drive to put the visitors up, 10-0.

The field goal battle continued and this time the Flames were able to crack the

scoreboard after another drive stalled inside the James Madison 10-yard line.

Thanks to a 26-yard kickoff return by Kevin Fogg and a 28-yard Hayes reception, Liberty was able to penetrate deep into Dukes territory.

The Flames tried to find the end zone on a flag route from Brown to Summers, but the senior was well defended and Liberty had to settle for a 24-yard field goal by Alex Kacere.

The 24-yard kick was the first of the redshirt freshman's Liberty career and trimmed the visitor's halftime lead to 10-3.

Head coach Danny Rocco and his staff seemed to make some halftime adjustments, which resulted in Liberty rushing seven out of 10 plays for 28 yards on the 42-yard scoring drive to start the second half.

The last was a two-yard scramble by Brown to the right, as the Walter Payton Award candidate leaped over a pile of James Madison defenders and stretched the ball over the goal line to knot the game at 10-10 with 9:33 left in the third quarter.

The Dukes quickly responded with their own 10-play effort, this one amounting for 74 yards that allowed the visitors to regain the lead on Scott's second scoring run of the night.

The Flames tried to keep the scoring drive to three points, but the Dukes' offensive line opened up a sizeable hole on the right side, giving Scott enough room to break free for a 10-yard run on a third-and-one play and put James Madison up 17-10 at the 4:32 mark.

The back-and-forth battle continued with Liberty tying the game for the second time, following an eight-play, 68-yard drive during the closing seconds of the third quarter.

The Brown to Hayes connection continued, as the seniors found each other on two key third-down plays.

The first was a 28-yard reception over the middle of the field to get the Flames into the red zone, while the second came three plays later when Brown rolled out and found Hayes on the near side of the field on a five-yard slate with 57 seconds remaining in the third.

James Madison answered right back with the Dukes keeping it on the ground seven

times on the nine-play, 63-yard scoring drive. The seventh and final time, Scott crossed the goal line for the third time on the night, giving James Madison a 24-17 lead with 12:16 left in the game.

Liberty tried to keep the back-and-forth battle going by answering again. Another lengthy return by Fogg for 27 yards, followed by a 19-yard play action pass from Brown to tight end Tommy Shaver got the Flames into Dukes territory.

However, Brown committed the game's first turnover on a deep pass play just in front of the end zone that was intercepted by Jakarie Jackson to give the Dukes the ball back with 11 minutes left to play in the game. The Dukes nearly gave the ball back three plays later, when Thorpe fumbled the ball on an option play.

James Madison was forced to punt following their second third-and-out series of the evening. Three plays later, Brown was able to successfully connect on another deep pass, when he found Chris Summers, the other Walter Payton Award candidate, open over the middle. The senior caught the ball at the 20-yard line and quickly got to the corner of the end zone to knot the score at 24-24 with 7:45 left in the fourth quarter.

The Flames tried to move the ball on the ensuing drive and crossed midfield after a 27-yard pass completion from Brown to Summers. However, the reception was negated after Liberty's 11th and final penalty of the night.

The play forced a third-and-22 situation, where Brown was sacked for the third time on the night. Mike Larsson connected on a 59-yard punt that rolled more than 20 yards, putting James Madison at its own 25-yard line with just over two minutes left.

Scott carried the ball five times on the next drive, while Thorpe completed both his pass attempts to quickly move the Dukes down the field. The first completion was the game-winning drive's key play, as the red-shirt junior completed a 32-yard pass over the middle to Kerby Long on a third-and-two play to extend the drive.

Five plays later, Starke connected on the game-winner, more than clearing the upright in the south end zone on a 40-yarder as the game clock expired.
