Four Wins is Fun

Liberty entered the Big South records books, last Saturday, following its 27-20 double overtime victory over Presbyterian College. With the win, Liberty became the first program in Big South history to start conference play with a perfect 4-0 record for five-consecutive seasons. The last time the Flames did not enter the month of November undefeated in Big South play was 2006, head coach Danny Rocco's first season.

Still Streaking

It took two extra periods of football, but the Flames were able to extend its Big South home winning streak following a thrilling 27-20 double overtime victory over Presbyterian College. With the victory, Liberty extends its Big South home winning streak to 14-straight games with the Flames last home setback against a conference foe coming in 2006.

The Last Time - No. 19/21 Liberty 41, VMI 7

Oct. 16, 2010 - Lexington, Va. - Foster Stadium (7,157)

A dominating first-half performance, spotlighted by a record-setting day by Chris Summers, allowed the No. 19/21 Flames to capture a 41-7 Big South victory over VMI inside of Foster Stadium.

It took a few drives for the two teams to feel each other out, as the game remained scoreless until the midway point of the first.

Following the first three-and-out series of the day by VMI, Liberty took over at its own 16-yard line. After Tyler Brennan completed short-yardage passes to Mike Brown and Pat Kelly, Brown returned under center found Summers open deep downfield.

On the seventh play of the 84-yard scoring drive, Brown faked a handoff to SirChauncey Holloway, causing the Keydets' defense to come to the line of scrimmage. However, Brown pulled the ball back and found Summers open down the sideline for a 54-yard touchdown reception at the 7:44 mark of the first quarter.

Following a second-straight three-and-out series by the home squad, Liberty took to the air to set up its next touchdown, doubling up its lead to 14-0.

Brown completed three 10-plus yard passes on the five-play, 52-yard drive to Tommy Shaver (15 yards), B.J. Hayes (16 yards) and Peter Gagliardi (11 yards). The trio of passing plays set up a three-yard burst up the middle by Holloway to give the Flames a two touchdown lead at the 3:30 mark.

VMI's offense, that finished the first quarter with negative two yards of total offense on nine plays, continued to struggle and was forced to punt the ball away after a fourth three-and-out series in a row.

The Marc Ray punt only sailed 19 yards, giving the Flames their best field possession of the first half at the VMI 40-yard line.

Four plays later, Brown and Summers hooked up for a record-setting pass play, as Brown found Summers open over the middle for a 23-yard touchdown pass to push Liberty's lead to 21-0 at 10:57 in the second quarter.

The scoring play gave Summers his 11th touchdown reception of the year, breaking Liberty's previous single-season school record of 10 touchdown catches by Eric Green in 1989.

The Keydets managed to pick up their first new set of downs on the afternoon on a 16-yard pass play from Adam Morgan to T.J. Talley, but VMI was forced to kick the ball away four plays later.

During the last nine minutes of the half, Liberty was able to extend its margin by 10 additional points, thanks to a third Summers touchdown and a 25-yard field goal by Matt Bevins.

The drive where Liberty picked up three points by virtue of Bevins' 42nd career field goal, was aided by a special teams mishap from the Keydets.

Liberty was forced to punt the ball away a three-and-out series, but Mike Larsson's 43-yard punt was mishandled by Mike Smith and Kevin Fogg recovered the turnover at the VMI 18-yard line.

On Liberty's next possession, Brown completed his last three pass attempts on the eight-play, 56-yard scoring drive, when he threaded the needle for a 17-yard strike to Summers with 1:14 left before the intermission.

The Flames controlled all aspects of the game during the opening 30 minutes of play, outgaining VMI, 322 to 40 yards. Liberty managed to record 18 first downs to VMI's two, while the Flames held a 19:25-10:35 time of possession edge.

Brown and Summers continued to add to their stellar seasons. Brown finished the first half 14-of-21 with 204 passing yards and three touchdowns, while leading the team with 36 rushing yards on six carries. Summers caught five passes for 115 yards and three scores.

Morgan was limited during the first half, as the quarterback was 4-of-11 for 32 yards, but lost 23 yards on three different sacks. Chaz Jones carried the ball six times for 21 yards.

VMI tried to make a push to get back into the game early in the third quarter. However, the Keydets were forced to punt on the first drive and Cameron Jones was intercepted by Danny Broggin on their next drive, ending any threat the home squad had of making a comeback.

Liberty did manage to add 10 additional points during the last 30 minutes, while VMI ended the threat of the seventh

shutout under head coach Danny Rocco with a fourth quarter rushing touchdown by Chaz Jones at 10:15.

The Flames used the Broggin interception to jumpstart one scoring drive. Seven plays after the turnover, Korrey Davis recorded his first rushing touchdown at Liberty, when redshirt sophomore burst up the middle to score from six yards out at 4:45 of the third quarter.

Bevins gave Liberty its last score, when the kicker capped the first drive of the fourth quarter with a 42-yard field goal at 12:30. The lengthy kick gave Bevins his 43rd career field goal, which tied him with Daniel Whitehead (1991-94) for the program's career record.

Liberty, who came into the game ranked No. 7 nationally in total offense, finished the game with 447 total offensive yards. It marked the third-straight game the Flames have passed the 400-yard mark the fifth time in seven games this season.

The Flames posted their second-best team rushing total of the season, running for 174 yards on 40 carries and two rushing touchdowns. The Flames hit the 200-yard passing mark for the seventh-straight game by passing for 273 yards and three scores.

Brown was once again Liberty's No. 1 option during the game, as the junior quarterback finished with 277 total offensive yards. He completed 17-of-28 passing attempts for 231 yards and three touchdown passes, while leading the team with seven rushed for another 46 yards.

Davis finished second on the squad, rushing for 32 yards on six carries, while Irwin Coleman carried the ball nine times for 28 yards.

Summers posted his fourth 100-yard game of the year, as the junior caught six passes for 120 yards and three scores. Following his second three-touchdown game of the year, the junior currently leads the nation with 12 touchdown receptions.

Liberty's dominating defensive effort, which just yielded 213 total offensive yards to VMI, was a team effort, with the Flames' leading tackler finishing with five stops.

Broggin finished with Liberty's other two sacks, totaling a loss of 15 yards, while adding three solo tackles.

News and Notes about Liberty's recent Match-Up with Presbyterian College

Big South Highlights:

- With its victory over Charleston Southern, Liberty becomes the first Big South program in league history to begin conference play 4-0 for five-consecutive seasons.
- Liberty's all-time Big South record under head coach Danny Rocco is now 25-4 (86.2 percent).
- Presbyterian College snapped a 13-game streak where Liberty had scored 30 or more points at home against Big South foes.

Overtime Highlights:

- Liberty and Presbyterian College's game was decided in double overtime, marking the ninth overtime game in program history.
- Liberty snapped a two-game losing skid in overtime with its victory over Presbyterian College, pushing Liberty's all-time overtime record to 4-5.
- Prior to the Presbyterian College game, Liberty's last overtime game was a 48-41 setback to William & Mary on Sept. 15, 2007.
- Prior to the victory against Presbyterian College, Liberty's last overtime victory was a 49-42 win over Hofstra on Nov. 22, 2003.
- The game against Presbyterian College was just the second time (in nine Liberty overtimes games) that was not decided during the first overtime period.

Offensive Highlights:

- For the first time in four games, Liberty was held below 30 points, finishing the Presbyterian College game with 27 points scored.
- Following the Presbyterian College game, Liberty now ranks No. 7 in the country in scoring offense, as the Flames are averaging 36.33 points per game.
- Following the Presbyterian College game, Liberty has outscored its Big South foes 104-0 before they could score their first points in the game (Gardner-Webb: 21-0; Coastal Carolina 42-0; Charleston Southern: 38-0; Presbyterian College: 3-0).
- During its four Big South games this season, Liberty has outscored Big South opponents 104-10 during the first half of the game.
- The Flames are currently on pace to score 400 points exactly this season, which would mark the fifth-straight season Liberty has scored 400 or more points in a year.

- For the sixth time in nine games this year, Liberty finished a game with 400 or more total offensive yards (468).
- Following the Presbyterian College game, Liberty now ranks No. 20 nationally in total offense (423.22 yards per game).

- Liberty currently ranks No. 23 nationally in first down offense following the Presbyterian College game (21.33 per game).
- For the third-straight game and fourth time in the last five contests, the Flames finished the game with double-digit rushing first downs (10).
- For the third time this season and the 26th time under head coach Danny Rocco, Liberty rushed for 200 or more yards in a game (204).
- During the first four games of the season, Liberty rushed for 414 yards and four touchdowns (103.5 yards and 1.0 TDs per game).
- During the last five games of the season, Liberty has rushed for 1,059 yards and 15 touchdowns (211.8 yards and 3.0 TDs per game).
- For the seventh time this season and the 43rd time under head coach Danny Rocco, Liberty finished a game with 200 or more passing yards (264).
- Following the Presbyterian College game, Liberty now ranks No. 24 nationally in passing offense (258.44 yards per game).
- For the just the second time this season, Liberty was limited to just a single touchdown pass, the game-winning 25-yarder from Mike Brown to Chris Summers in double overtime.

- The Flames managed to pick up a new set of downs on 1-of-2 fourth-down plays and now rank No. 11 nationally in fourth-down conversion efficiency (70.00 percent/7-of-10).
 - The Flames finished the Presbyterian College game by amassing a season-best 34:42 time of possession.
- Defensive Highlights:**
- For the second-straight game and the third time this season, Liberty allowed an opponent to amass 400 or more total offensive yards (401).
 - The last time Liberty allowed back-to-back opponents to rack up 400 or more total offensive yards was in 2008 (Youngstown State – 427 yards, Coastal Carolina – 534 yards).
 - Liberty has now allowed a total of 14 different opponents to accumulate 400 or more total offensive yards under head coach Danny Rocco.
 - Following the Presbyterian College game, Liberty now ranks No. 21 in the country in total defense (315.11 yards allowed per game).
 - Presbyterian College became the fourth Big South foe this year Liberty has held scoreless during the first quarter of the game.
 - Presbyterian College was held scoreless until midway through the third quarter, meaning the Flames have allowed a total of 10 points during the first half of four Big South games this year.

- Mike Larsson (Sr., P)**
- Mike Larsson finished the Presbyterian College game with four punts for 164 yards.
 - Mike Larsson finished the Presbyterian College game averaging 41.0 yards per punt, marking the 18th time in his career the senior has finished a game averaging 40.0 or more yards per game.
 - Mike Larsson has averaged 40 or more yards per punt in eight of nine games this year and 14 of his last 15 games.
 - With his four punts against Presbyterian College, Mike Larsson continues to narrowly maintain the minimum number of punts to qualify for national punting statistics (NCAA minimum – 3.6 punts per game ... Larsson averaging 3.67 punts per game).
 - Following the Presbyterian College game, Mike Larsson currently ranks No. 7 nationally in punting average (43.00 yards per punt).
 - Mike Larsson placed two of his four punts inside of Presbyterian College's 20-yard line, giving him 47 career punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line (38.2 percent/47-of-123).
- Matt Bevins (Sr., K)**
- A game after becoming the Big South's all-time leading scorer with 305 career points, Matt Bevins missed his third game of the year with an injury against Presbyterian College.
 - Matt Bevins is one of five active FCS kickers in the country with 300 or more career points scored.
- Nick Sigmon (R-Fr., LB)**
- Nick Sigmon posted his second-straight double-tackle effort to lead the Flames with 10 stops against Presbyterian College on Saturday.
 - Through nine games this season, Liberty has only had three players finish a game with 10 or more tackles (Nick Sigmon twice and Brandon Robinson against James Madison).
 - Following his 10-stop effort against Presbyterian College, Nick Sigmon now leads the Flames on the season with 51 stops.

Saturday Night Lights

Under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames are 19-6 in night games. Since 1976, Liberty has compiled a 60-68-3 record in night games.

In Broad Daylight

Under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames are 28-12 in games played during the day. Since 1976, Liberty is 130-120-1 in day games.

Natural Versus Artificial Surfaces

Under head coach Danny Rocco, the Flames are 34-12 on artificial turf and 13-6 on natural grass. Overall, Liberty is 104-111-4 on natural grass and 94-80 on artificial turf. The Flames play their home games at Williams Stadium, which has an artificial surface, as new state-of-the-art FieldTurf was installed prior to the start of the 2006 season. Liberty has posted a 28-5 record at home since the new type of surface was installed.

Overtime Update

The Flames enter today's game having posted a 4-5 record in overtime games. Liberty's last overtime game came on Oct. 29, 2011, when the Flames secured a 27-20 double overtime win over Presbyterian College in Lynchburg, Va. Liberty has only played two of its nine overtime games away from Williams Stadium.

Back in the Big South

Liberty began its 10th season of competition in Big South Conference action when the Flames traveled to Boiling Springs, N.C., to face Gardner-Webb on Oct. 8, 2011. Liberty won its league opener against the Bulldogs, 35-3. Since beginning league play in 2002, Liberty has posted a 32-12 Big South record.

On Aug. 28, 2009, during Liberty University's convocation service, Chancellor Jerry Falwell, Jr., announced plans for extensive stadium expansion at Williams Stadium and in the Vines Center, which will put Liberty's athletics facilities on par with those at the highest level of NCAA competition.

"I think these projects will take us to a higher level of competition," Falwell said. "It will put Liberty on the same level as other major universities in the state and in the region. I think it is amazing what we are accomplishing with God's help. The sky's the limit for Liberty."

Before a packed house inside the Vines Center, Falwell unveiled plans to increase Williams Stadium seating to 19,200 by the opening of the 2010 season, plus plans to add 3,000 seats inside the Vines Center.

Directly following the Flames final home against VMI on Nov. 7, 2009, Liberty began to renovate Williams Stadium, marking the first major expansion to the Flames home for football since the stadium was completed in 1989.

The first of a three-phase plan calls for the addition of 6,600 seats added to the west side of the stadium, plus a 34,000-square foot press box. The brick and glass encased, Jeffersonian-style four-story tower will house club-level seating for qualified Flames Club donors, 18 permanent luxury suites, a banquet room which can hold up to 500 people, a 1,000-seat classroom and a state-of-the-art press area.

"The expansion of Williams Stadium will have a monumental effect on Liberty University and its football program," stated Jeff Barber, Liberty's Director of Athletics. "Above all else, this shows a great commitment from the University, and when you have a commitment, a lot of wonderful things can happen."

Phase One of the plan is part of a multiphase effort to boost the stadium's seating from its current capacity of 12,000 to 30,000 over the next five years. Phases Two and Three will add a new 4,000-seat middeck for the east side of the stadium and 6,400 seats in a horseshoe-shape area surrounding the end zone in the south end of the stadium.

When all three phases are complete, the stadium will have undergone an estimated \$22 million in improvements. The renovated facility will also ready the stadium for the future construction of upper decks on the west and east sides of the stadium that will bring the capacity to 60,000.

"You cannot ignore the importance of facilities in recruiting. Kids always look for nicer facilities and to be a part of a team where they feel the program is an important overall part of the University," stated Liberty Head Football Coach Danny Rocco. "Above all, I think it just shows a great commitment from our University's administration to get our program to a level of national prominence."

Falwell said the Williams Stadium expansion is keeping up with Liberty's overall growth pattern. Fall enrollment for residential studies this year is expected to reach 12,200. Liberty had just over 5,000 on-campus students just 11 years ago.

"This stadium project is a natural step for Liberty in its progression from a small Bible college to a major university," added Falwell. "That was the goal from the beginning – to be for evangelical young people what Notre Dame is to the Catholics and what Brigham Young is to the Mormons. Athletics, and football in particular, was always a big part in that vision."

"Prospective student-athletes will see Liberty as a serious contender in NCAA Division I athletics," continued Falwell. "We'll be able to better recruit the top student-athletes in every sport. Improvements like this will help us convey the message that Liberty is achieving excellence in academics and in all of our facilities and programs. I think this will provide a major boost in both our athletics and academic recruiting. My father always said, 'If it's Christian, it ought to be better.'"

Game No. 1 - N.C. State 43, No. 22/18 Liberty 21

Sept. 3, 2011 - Raleigh, N.C. - Carter-Finley Stadium (56,564)

No. 22/18 Liberty committed seven turnovers, including two during the final five minutes of the game, which broke open a close contest with N.C. State. The last two giveaways led to the Wolfpack's final 13 points in a 43-21 win over Liberty inside of Carter-Finley Stadium.

The loss is only the second season-opening setback for the Flames during the six-year tenure of head coach Danny Rocco. The first was a 33-20 loss to the BIG EAST's West Virginia to open up the 2009 campaign.

Nearly 15 minutes of football went by before either team could put a dent in the scoreboard, as N.C. State took its first lead of the evening on a 32-yard field goal by Niklas Sade.

The two teams traded a pair of possessions before the Wolfpack mounted an 11-play, 64-yard scoring drive that gave Sade, a true freshman, his first collegiate field goal.

The drive nearly started 20 yards back, as a punt by Mike Larsson was almost downed at the N.C. State one-yard line. However, the ball just trickled into the end zone to give N.C. State possession at its own 20-yard line.

Five-straight rushing plays led to four completions in a row by N.C. State quarterback Mike Glennon. A fifth-consecutive try was unsuccessful when Glennon was flushed from the pocket and had to hurry an attempt to Jay Smith to set up the field goal.

A pair of miscues early in the second quarter led to some excitement and the first Liberty lead of the evening.

A high snap to Mike Brown led to a loose ball, as the ball was stripped from Liberty's senior quarterback by Darryl Cato-Bishop and picked up by Audie Cole at the N.C. State 38-yard line.

However, Liberty quickly returned the favor and sacked Glennon on the next play. The tackle by Walt Aikens jarred the ball loose and Francis Bah picked up the free ball and returned it 32 yards to give Liberty a 7-3 edge with 13:30 left in the opening half.

The score remained the same for the next 10 minutes until an 82-yard punt return by T.J. Graham gave N.C. State a 9-7 lead with 3:38 remaining until halftime.

Liberty was forced to punt on a fourth-and-12 play at its own 35-yard line. Larsson's

punt skipped over Graham's head and the senior only gained five yards before being tackled.

However, the Wolfpack were called for holding on the play and the Flames elected to retry the punt to attempt to pin N.C. State inside its 20-yard line.

Graham then took advantage of the extra opportunity, as the senior fielded the ball and quickly got to the outside. After getting one last key block around midfield, the senior found the end zone for his second career punt return and the 11th-longest in N.C. State history.

A penalty was called on the point after attempt and Sade did not find the extra chance to his liking, as the freshman missed to the right to keep the score 9-7.

Another Liberty turnover allowed the Wolfpack to extend their lead to 16-7 going into the locker room at halftime.

Following a 39-yard kickoff return by Kevin Fogg, Liberty started with possession at the N.C. State 47-yard line. After a two-yard rushing gain by Sirchauncey Holloway, Brown's attempted pass over the middle was intercepted by D.J. Green to give the home team the ball back.

Following two lengthy passing plays by Glennon, Liberty nearly made a goal line stand. But a second effort by James Washington gave the junior halfback a one-yard touchdown score, capping off a quick 10-play, 57-yard drive to extend N.C. State's margin to nine with 32 seconds left before the halftime break.

The third turnover of the game by Brown led to N.C. State's first touchdown of the second half. Trying to reach the first-down marker on a second-and-seven play, Brown was stopped one yard short by Earl Wolff. While the safety was bringing Brown to the ground, he stripped the ball loose. Brian Slay recovered the miscue and returned it 52 yards for a score. The fourth-longest fumble return in Wolfpack history pushed N.C. State's lead to 23-7 at the 8:51 mark of the third quarter.

Following a 24-yard return by Korrey Davis, Brown got to the outside for a 21-yard burst. N.C. State was whistled for a late hit out of bounds, giving the Flames the ball at the 27-yard line.

The Walter Payton candidate connection of Brown and Chris Summers then found each other for the first time in 2011. Brown lofted a ball into the end zone 27 yards downfield, giving Summers his 20th career touchdown. Following a short pass from Brown to Pat Kelly in the back left corner of the end zone, the two-point conversion pulled the Flames within eight, 23-15, 25 seconds later.

Big plays continue to lead to scoring efforts, this time benefiting the homestanding Wolfpack. After a 44-yard kickoff return by Graham that started N.C. State at Liberty's 33-yard line, Curtis Underwood scored two plays later on a 33-yard run to give the Wolfpack a 15-point edge, 30-15, just 10 seconds after Liberty's score.

The Flames pieced together an eight-play, 40-yard scoring drive to pull back within 12 points, 30-18, following a 50-yard field goal by two-time All-America kicker Matt Bevins. The 50-yard boot was the fourth 50-plus yard field goal of the senior's career.

After Liberty forced a three-and-out series, the Flames continued to chip away at N.C. State's advantage. Another eight-play drive stalled at the 21-yard line when Aldreakis Allen was stopped on an attempted run on a third-and-three play.

Liberty was forced to settle for Bevins' second field goal of the second half, a 38-yarder, trimming the lead to nine, 30-21, just 39 seconds into the final quarter. The three-pointer was his school-record 56th of his career.

Six minutes later, Rocco challenged a call and got the initial ruling on the field overturned, giving the Flames the ball back after a fumble by Underwood at the N.C. State 32-yard line.

However, Brown fumbled on the very next play when he was struck by Jeff Rieskamp and the loose football was scooped up by Slay with 7:40 left to play.

During the remaining minutes of the contest, N.C. State scored twice, once on a Glennon pass to Mario Carter and the second on a 19-yard rushing touchdown by Washington. Washington's second score of the night was set up by an interception, when David Amerson picked off Brown for the third and final time of the night.

Game No. 2 - No. 24/21 Liberty 38, Robert Morris 7

Sept. 10, 2011 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (15,805)

Four sacks and three interceptions set the tone for No. 24/21 Liberty's 38-7 home-opening victory over Robert Morris, inside of Williams Stadium.

The two teams used most of the first quarter to feel each other out, as the game remained scoreless through the first nine minutes.

Liberty had excellent starting position for its second drive of the game, thanks to a 30-yard punt return by B.J. Hayes. The Big South preseason all-conference punt returner fielded the Tony LaMancusa punt at the Robert Morris 42-yard line and found a seam down the middle of the field to get to the Robert Morris 12-yard line.

Following a seven-yard gain by Sirchauncey Holloway, Walter Payton Award candidate Mike Brown called his own number. The senior quickly got to the outside to score his 21st career rushing touchdown, giving Liberty a 7-0 lead after a five-yard run.

The Flames doubled their lead during the closing minutes of the opening quarter, thanks to a two-player connection.

Liberty managed to quickly march downfield, scoring on a six-play, 85-yard drive that took just 1:43 off the clock. Four of the six plays were pass completions from Brown to Pat Kelly, including the scoring dart, a 39-yard lofted ball into the corner of the zone.

The second quarter was dominated by both team's defensive units, with the two teams combining for 89 total offensive yards during the second 15-minutes of the game.

The lone legitimate scoring chance either squad had during the period came late, as Liberty penetrated the Colonials 20-yard line shortly after Kevin Fogg picked off a Jeff Sinclair pass.

However, Holloway gave the ball back four plays later, when it came loose on a run up the middle and was recovered by Sam Miller at the Robert Morris 15-yard line.

Robert Morris had more chances to advance the ball during the first half, finishing the opening 30 minutes of the game with 34 plays to Liberty's 30 plays. But the Flames made the most of their chances, more than doubling the Colonials with a 193 to 81 total offensive yard edge.

Brown was once again Liberty's top offensive weapon, accounting for 167 of

Liberty's 193 total offensive yards. Brown carried the ball eight times for 29 yards and a score, while completing 10-of-14 passing attempts for 138 yards and a scoring pass.

Kelly was Brown's top target, finishing the first half with four catches for 75 yards, which all came on the last scoring drive of the opening half.

Robert Morris was paced by Justin Brooks and Sinclair during the first half. Brooks rushed 10 times for 30 yards, while Sinclair completed 6-of-13 passing attempts.

The story of the third quarter was a pair of interceptions during the 15-minute span that allowed the Flames to increase their lead by 14 points.

Fogg became the first player since the 2004 season to intercept two passes in one game, when he stepped in front of a Sinclair pass and returned it 11 yards to the Robert Morris four-yard line. The last player to accomplish the same feat was Jordan Alford against Elon during the closing game of the year on Nov. 20.

Two plays later, Brown scored from one yard out, but the play was negated after a Liberty holding penalty. The flag only delayed Brown's second rushing touchdown of the game, as the quarterback carried the ball on each of the next two plays, including a seven-yard scamper at 8:21 to push Liberty's lead to 21-0.

Robert Morris managed to cross the 50-yard line for the first time on the night during the ensuing drive, only to give it away six plays later.

The Colonials looked like they were piecing together their first scoring effort of the night, getting to the Liberty 33-yard line. However, Walt Aikens intercepted a pass at the 29-yard line, Sinclair's third thrown interception of the night, to give the Flames the ball back.

Liberty used exactly 120 seconds on the next drive, marching 65 yards downfield on six plays to push its lead to 28-0 at the 1:50 mark.

Two deep passing plays spotlighted the driving effort. The first was slant to Chris Summers, with Liberty's other Walter Payton Award candidate catching a 26-yard strike in double coverage.

Four plays later, Brown was able to avoid the Robert Morris pass rush and found Ryan Ferguson open in the end zone for his first collegiate touchdown on a 37-yard passing play.

The Colonials finally cracked the scoreboard during their opening drive of the fourth quarter, piecing together their longest drive of the day of 12 plays and 67 yards.

The scoring push was capped off by a nine-yard passing strike to Vince Mongeluzzo at the 10:25 mark.

Liberty quickly answered back and sealed the victory, when Fogg returned the ensuing kickoff 88 yards for a touchdown, giving the Flames their first special teams score of the 2011 season.

Matt Bevins capped off the night with a 23-yard field goal at the 2:17 mark, his 16th-straight field goal and the 57th of his career.

Liberty outgained Robert Morris on the night with 355 total offensive yards to the visitor's 234, despite the Colonials finishing the night with 69 total plays to the Flames 56.

Brown had his 13th-straight 200-plus total offensive yard game, as the senior finished with 252 yards. The quarterback led the Flames rushing effort with 11 carries for 43 yards, while completing 13-of-22 passing plays for 209 yards.

Brown played a part in all four of Liberty's offensive touchdowns, throwing for two and rushing for two more.

Kelly led all Liberty receivers with his four first-half catches for 75 yards. Summers and Ferguson each finished the night with identical numbers, hauling in three passes for 55 yards.

Brooks led the Colonials with 22 rushing attempts for 86 yards, while Sinclair finished the night 12-of-26 passing for 105 yards, three interceptions and a touchdown pass.

Liberty's defensive leader on the night was Brent Vinson, who tied a career high with eight tackles, including 1.5 sacks for a loss of 19 total yards.

KaJuan Lee also tied a career high, matching his seven-tackle effort against Gardner-Webb in 2009 with the same number of stops.

Game No. 3 - No. 13/14 James Madison 27, No. 22/22 Liberty 24

Sept. 17, 2011 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (18,878)

A low-scoring first half turned into a second-half shootout that ended on a game-winning field goal by Cameron Starke, lifting No. 13/14 James Madison to a 27-24 victory over No. 22/20 Liberty inside Williams Stadium.

Big plays helped the visiting Dukes get on the scoreboard first, with James Madison scoring quickly on its opening drive of the game. Jordan Anderson opened the contest with a 32-yard kickoff return, thanks to the sophomore finding a hole late during the return.

Two 24-yard plays during the seven-play, 55-yard scoring drive keyed the opening push by the James Madison offense. The first was a 24-yard pass play from Justin Thorpe to Renard Robinson and the second was a 24-yard rushing effort by Dae'Quan Scott to get inside the red zone.

Scott kept the ball on the next two plays, including a three-yard scoring burst up the middle, giving James Madison a 7-0 edge at 11:30.

Sizeable gains continued to be the theme of the first half and the largest of the opening 30 minutes of the game for Liberty seemed to get the Flames into scoring position. On the first play of the second quarter, Mike Brown rolled out and hit B.J. Hayes open in the flat and the senior scampered 60 yards down the field before he was pushed out of bounds.

The longest reception in Hayes' career got Liberty down to the 10-yard line; however, Brown was sacked for a three-yard loss and the Flames were whistled for a 15-yard unsportsmanlike conduct penalty.

The negative-yardage stop and the flag pushed the Flames back to the 36-yard line, where Matt Bevins missed his second 43-yard field goal attempt on the night. The first, which took place during the middle of the first quarter, snapped a string of 16-straight successful field goal attempts.

The Dukes responded and pieced together their longest scoring drive of the night, when Cameron Starke connected on a 32-yard field goal with 5:07 left on the opening half clock. The boot capped off a 14-play, 7:50-drive to put the visitors up, 10-0.

The field goal battle continued and this time the Flames were able to crack the

scoreboard after another drive stalled inside the James Madison 10-yard line.

Thanks to a 26-yard kickoff return by Kevin Fogg and a 28-yard Hayes reception, Liberty was able to penetrate deep into Dukes territory.

The Flames tried to find the end zone on a flag route from Brown to Summers, but the senior was well defended and Liberty had to settle for a 24-yard field goal by Alex Kacere.

The 24-yard kick was the first of the redshirt freshman's Liberty career and trimmed the visitor's halftime lead to 10-3.

Head coach Danny Rocco and his staff seemed to make some halftime adjustments, which resulted in Liberty rushing seven out of 10 plays for 28 yards on the 42-yard scoring drive to start the second half.

The last was a two-yard scramble by Brown to the right, as the Walter Payton Award candidate leaped over a pile of James Madison defenders and stretched the ball over the goal line to knot the game at 10-10 with 9:33 left in the third quarter.

The Dukes quickly responded with their own 10-play effort, this one amounting for 74 yards that allowed the visitors to regain the lead on Scott's second scoring run of the night.

The Flames tried to keep the scoring drive to three points, but the Dukes' offensive line opened up a sizeable hole on the right side, giving Scott enough room to break free for a 10-yard run on a third-and-one play and put James Madison up 17-10 at the 4:32 mark.

The back-and-forth battle continued with Liberty tying the game for the second time, following an eight-play, 68-yard drive during the closing seconds of the third quarter.

The Brown to Hayes connection continued, as the seniors found each other on two key third-down plays.

The first was a 28-yard reception over the middle of the field to get the Flames into the red zone, while the second came three plays later when Brown rolled out and found Hayes on the near side of the field on a five-yard slate with 57 seconds remaining in the third.

James Madison answered right back with the Dukes keeping it on the ground seven

times on the nine-play, 63-yard scoring drive. The seventh and final time, Scott crossed the goal line for the third time on the night, giving James Madison a 24-17 lead with 12:16 left in the game.

Liberty tried to keep the back-and-forth battle going by answering again. Another lengthy return by Fogg for 27 yards, followed by a 19-yard play action pass from Brown to tight end Tommy Shaver got the Flames into Dukes territory.

However, Brown committed the game's first turnover on a deep pass play just in front of the end zone that was intercepted by Jakarie Jackson to give the Dukes the ball back with 11 minutes left to play in the game. The Dukes nearly gave the ball back three plays later, when Thorpe fumbled the ball on an option play.

James Madison was forced to punt following their second third-and-out series of the evening. Three plays later, Brown was able to successfully connect on another deep pass, when he found Chris Summers, the other Walter Payton Award candidate, open over the middle. The senior caught the ball at the 20-yard line and quickly got to the corner of the end zone to knot the score at 24-24 with 7:45 left in the fourth quarter.

The Flames tried to move the ball on the ensuing drive and crossed midfield after a 27-yard pass completion from Brown to Summers. However, the reception was negated after Liberty's 11th and final penalty of the night.

The play forced a third-and-22 situation, where Brown was sacked for the third time on the night. Mike Larsson connected on a 59-yard punt that rolled more than 20 yards, putting James Madison at its own 25-yard line with just over two minutes left.

Scott carried the ball five times on the next drive, while Thorpe completed both his pass attempts to quickly move the Dukes down the field. The first completion was the game-winning drive's key play, as the red-shirt junior completed a 32-yard pass over the middle to Kerby Long on a third-and-two play to extend the drive.

Five plays later, Starke connected on the game-winner, more than clearing the upright in the south end zone on a 40-yarder as the game clock expired.

Game No. 4 - No. 15/16 Lehigh 27, No. 23 Liberty 24

Sept. 24, 2011 - Bethlehem, Pa. - Goodman Stadium (6,185)

For the second week in a row, Liberty's Top 25 match-up came down to a last-second field goal attempt. After falling to No. 13/14 James Madison at home on a clock-expiring 40-yarder, the Flames could not find the same result, as Alex Kacere attempted to send the game into overtime with a 54-yard yard attempt. For the first time on the year, the Flames took their opening drive of the game and managed to put points on the scoreboard. The Flames implemented a similar hurry-up style as they had during previous games in 2011, and managed to get inside the Mountain Hawks' 10-yard line. Mike Brown completed 4-of-4 passing attempts for 43 yards during the 12-play effort, but was sacked for a seven-yard loss on a third-and-goal situation. Liberty was forced to settle for a 39-yard field goal by Alex Kacere at the 9:41 mark, giving Liberty the early 3-0 edge.

For the second-straight effort, Liberty mounted a double-digit play drive which looked like it was going to add to the Flames' lead. On the 11th play of the drive, Brown avoided a tackle and found Pat Kelly open in the end zone for what would have been an 11-yard touchdown reception. However, the play was called back due to a personal foul. Head coach Danny Rocco then brought Kacere back onto the field, but the redshirt freshman had his first career missed field goal, pushing his 31-yard attempt wide left to keep the game's score at 3-0 following 15 minutes of action.

Penalties continued to be the story on the next drive, with flags flying against both teams during the Lehigh 13-play, 67-yard scoring push. The first penalty was called on the Flames, when Liberty was whistled for another personal foul after a tackle below the knees on Lehigh quarterback Chris Lum. The flag gave Lehigh a first-and-goal situation. However, the Mountain Hawks were called for a holding penalty on the next play, pushing the home team back so they would eventually have to settle for a 30-yard field goal. Tim Divers' first field goal of the season tied the game, 3-3, with 11:17 left to play in the opening half. Lehigh's Homecoming crowd did not have to wait nearly as long to see its Mountain Hawks put their next set of points on the scoreboard, as it only took

two additional plays. Lehigh's special teams, which had been plagued by mistakes during its first three games, pulled off an on-side kick to quickly give the Mountain Hawks the ball at the 45-yard line. Lum then found his All-America receiver Ryan Spadola open over the middle of the field. The junior outdistanced Liberty's defenders on a 55-yard touchdown play just 12 seconds later.

The offensive showdown that was expected early in the game finally started to take shape, when Liberty promptly responded with its first big play of the game. Brown and his All-America receiver, Chris Summers, found each other on three consecutive plays, with the last being a 49-yard touchdown reception at 10:06. The scoring play was the 22nd career touchdown catch of Summers' career, tying him for the program's record with Liberty Athletics Hall of Famer Kelvin Edwards (1982-85). Penalties continued to be the story of the opening half, as the second touchdown of the day was wiped off the scoreboard due to an infraction.

This time the yellow flag cost the home team, when Lum's screen play pass to Jack Drwal was negated after an offensive pass interference call. Lehigh would manage to take the lead, but it would be just by three points, 13-10, after a 30-yard Divers field goal at the 6:21 mark. Liberty tried to answer back and looked like it had regained the lead. However, Kelly's second touchdown of the afternoon was kept from him when he was flagged for offensive pass interference on what would have been a 22-yard touchdown reception in the corner of the end zone. On the very next play, Brown committed the first turnover of the afternoon, when his attempted pass downfield was intercepted by Jon Littlejohn.

Four plays later, Lehigh committed its first giveaway of the afternoon, when Walt Aikens stepped in front of a pass from Lum and returned it 46 yards for another seeming score. But Liberty was flagged for an illegal block during the return and the ball was brought back to the 28-yard line. On the very next play, Summers took over the program's all-time career touchdown reception mark, when Brown found him open in the end zone for a score to give the Flames the 17-13 lead with 2:22 left before halftime.

But the lead was once again short-lived for the Flames, as Lum found Keith Sherman open on a sideline route and the sophomore scampered down Liberty's side of the field for a 73-yard touchdown reception to give Lehigh the 20-17 halftime lead. Lehigh took the opening drive of the second half and methodically marched downfield, pushing its lead to 10 points, 27-17, on a 12-play, 70-yard drive that used 5:36 on the game clock. The 12th and final play was a four-yard burst by Michael Colvin, his first score of the season. The Mountain Hawks continued to keep the momentum on the next several drives, ones that forced Liberty to punt and another where Brown was picked off for the second time on the day. However the pendulum seemed to swing back in Liberty's favor for a while, after a bad punt snap and a 15-yard rushing touchdown by Allen at the 2:45 of the third quarter pulled Liberty back within three points, 27-24. The momentum continued in Liberty's favor during the first play of the fourth quarter. Facing a fourth-and-12 situation from the Flames' 28-yard line, Leigh head coach Andy Coen elected to go for it rather than attempt a field goal. Lum dropped back and tried to find an open receiver in the end zone, but Aikens was able to record his second interception of the afternoon and give Liberty another chance. Both team's stout offenses went quite for a while until the Flames pieced together their longest drive of the second half. After starting at the one-yard line, Liberty managed to march deep into Lehigh territory. On a third-and-three play from the 21-yard line, Brown ran out to the outside for the first down. But the ball was stripped from the senior's hand just after he got past the yardage marker by Fred Mihal and the pigskin was recovered by Billy Boyko to give the home team the ball back. The Mountain Lions tried to run the clock out on the ensuing drive, but were forced to give the ball back on downs when their drive stalled at the Liberty 15-yard line. With 29 seconds on the clock, Brown completed three passes and rushed for 10 yards to get the Flames past midfield. Following a 17-yard out route to Kelly, Kacere was called upon to try the game-tying kick. But the freshman's attempt fell into the end zone and allowed the home to secure the victory.

Game No. 5 - Liberty 57, Kentucky Wesleyan 0

Oct. 1, 2011 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (15,782)

Liberty heads into Big South play following its seventh shutout under head coach Danny Rocco, as the Flames blanked visiting Kentucky Wesleyan, 57-0 inside of Williams Stadium.

The victory was an historic one for the Flames, as it marked the 200th time the Flames have posted a win on the gridiron since the program first began competition in 1973.

The Flames took advantage of a Panthers' miscue to crack the scoreboard midway through the first quarter. Pinned deep in its own territory during its first possession, Kentucky Wesleyan was forced to punt.

However, a bad snap to punter Jacob Jackson resulted in a Desmond Rice fumble recovery at the Panthers' seven-yard line.

Two plays later, Sirchauncey Holloway barreled through the line of scrimmage for his first rushing touchdown of the season and the 18th of his career. The short two-play, seven-yard drive gave Liberty a quick 7-0 lead with 6:35 left to play in the first quarter.

Another special teams situation gave Liberty its next scoring play the first time it touched the ball during the second quarter.

Jackson successfully got off a 35-yard punt, but Ervin Garner was able to find a seam on the right side of the field and nearly scored his first career punt return for a touchdown.

The return specialist was pushed out at the one-yard line, resulting in 39-yard return. Holloway was given the ball on the next play and easily burst into the end zone for his second score of the night to put Liberty up 14-0 with 14:38 left to play in the second quarter.

Punting woes continued to plague the Panthers, giving the Flames prime field position that resulted in Liberty's next scoring drive.

Following a three-and-out series, Kentucky Wesleyan was unable to center the ball correctly to Jackson, resulting in a seven-yard loss and Liberty taking over possession at the 14-yard line. Five plays later, Korrey Davis dove over the line of scrimmage from one-yard out, putting the Flames up 21-0 at the 10:20 mark for his first rushing touchdown of the season.

Liberty pieced together its second-longest scoring drive of the opening half on its next drive, pushing the Flames lead to 28-0 at the 5:41 mark.

Five of the six plays on the 65-yard drive were rushing plays by Holloway, including two double-digit rushing efforts.

Holloway's fifth and final carry of the drive was a sweeping play to the right, giving the junior his third score of the half on a two-yard burst.

Liberty managed to tack on three additional points just before halftime, when Alex Kacere capped off a quick 12-play, 67-yard drive with a career-long 42-yard field goal with four seconds left on the first half clock.

The Flames controlled most statistical categories during the opening half, starting with a 223 to 19 total offensive yard edge. Liberty also finished with 15 first downs during the opening 30 minutes to Kentucky Wesleyan's one first down.

Holloway was Liberty's offensive leader during the first half, as the junior rushed 16 times for 94 yards and three scores. Liberty did finish the first half with 64 passing yards, evenly shared between Tyler Brennan and Brian Hudson. Brennan, in his first career start at quarterback, was 3-of-7 for 24 yards, while Hudson was a perfect 5-of-5 for 40 yards.

Ryan Ferguson (33 yards) and Tommy Shaver (22 yards) were Liberty's top receivers, each finishing the first 30 minutes with three receptions.

Mike Connolly ended Kentucky Wesleyan's opening drive of the second half, when the senior linebacker had his second career interception at the Panthers' 32-yard line. On the next play, Holloway capped off his career night, when the junior found a hold on the left side of the line and scored from 32 yards out to push the Flames lead to 38-0 with 11:53 remaining in the third quarter.

The scoring run was the final time the Flames would score on the ground during the evening, but it was not the last time Liberty would find the end zone during the night.

The last three times Liberty would tack points on the scoreboard came through the

air, with touchdown passes from Brennan and the first two of Hudson's career.

The three scoring passing plays started when Brennan found tight end Tommy Shaver open on a 16-yard route to cap off a seven-play, 79-yard drive with 5:05 left in the third quarter.

The final two came during the last 15 minutes, beginning with Hudson giving Brandon Apon his first career touchdown reception on an eight-yard play just 55 seconds into the fourth quarter.

The final Liberty scoring drive of the night was finished when Hudson found Julian Poindexter open on a 25-yard slate route. The eight play of the 78-yard drive finished off the scoring on the night, giving Liberty its final 57-0 victory.

For the second time in the six-year tenure under Rocco, Liberty held an opponent below 100 total offensive yards. Kentucky Wesleyan finished the night with 74 yards on 56 plays, as compared to Liberty's season-best 486 yards on 67 plays.

The Flames rushed for a season-best 299 yards and had their sixth five-rushing touchdown game during Rocco's time on Liberty Mountain.

Liberty was paced by Holloway, who had his second career 100-yard rushing game. The junior finished the night with 17 carries for 126 yards and became the first Flames to score four rushing touchdowns since Eugene Goodman did against VMI on Oct. 4, 2003.

Brennan finished his first career start by completing 6-of-11 passing attempts for 83 yards, while Hudson was 10-of-12 for 104 yards.

Shaver finished the night with a career-best five receptions for 67 yards and his second career touchdown reception to lead all Liberty receivers. Poindexter (41 yards) and Ferguson (33 yards) followed with three receptions each.

Liberty's stout defense was led by Scott Hyland, who finished the night with five tackles (two solo, three assisted), followed by six players who ended the game with four tackles.

The Flames consistently got behind the line of scrimmage during the evening, finishing the game with 10 tackles for a loss.

Game No. 6 - Liberty 35, Gardner-Webb 3

Oct. 8, 2011 - Boiling Springs, N.C. - Spangler Stadium (6,253)

Liberty scored twice before Gardner-Webb's offense had its first possession of the game, setting the tone for a 35-3 victory for the Flames inside of Spangler Stadium.

The Flames wasted little time seizing control of the football game, jumping out to a 14-0 during the first six minutes of the contest. Liberty marched downfield on the game's opening drive, capping off a 10-play, 63-yard drive on Mike Brown's fourth rushing touchdown of the season.

The Flames were systemically marching the ball toward the end zone during their first possession of the day until Jordan Woods stopped Sirchauncey Holloway in the backfield, resulting in a third-and-eight situation.

However, Brown found Ervin Garner over the middle of the field for a 29-yard reception to the Runnin' Bulldog one-yard line. Two plays later, Brown easily crossed the goal line, staking Liberty to the early 7-0 lead with 10:28 left to play.

On the ensuing kickoff, Kevin Fogg tackled Gardner-Webb's returner Ricky Rhodes, forcing the ball loose. Randy Spann recovered the fumble, returning the ball to the Flames.

Two plays later, Brown lofted the ball over the Bulldogs' defense for Chris Summers, who caught the pass for his fifth touchdown reception of the year. The All-America receiver pulled in a 33-yard touchdown pass 44 seconds after the turnover, pushing Liberty's edge to 14-0.

Brown's precision first half passing continued to put points on the scoreboard for the Flames. Head coach Danny Rocco elected to go for it on a fourth-and-eight from the Gardner-Webb 29-yard line and Brown lifted the ball once into the air for an 18-yard reception.

Two plays later, Brown caught Garner in the corner of the end zone on a 10-yard pass, which the receiver pulled in just before hitting the ground to put the Flames up, 21-0, with 13:44 left to play in the opening half.

The score remained the same until the waning minutes of the opening half. Following five unfruitful drives to open the game, Gardner-Webb was finally able to get on the scoreboard during the final minute of the second quarter.

Following the Flames' first three-and-out series of the contest, the Bulldogs started their scoring effort in prime field position at Liberty's 45-yard line.

To double-digit passing plays from quarterback Lucas Beatty (19 yards to Kenny Little and 12 yards to James Perry, III) pushed the home team into the red zone. However, Beatty was only able to complete one of his next three passing attempts, forcing Gardner-Webb to settle for a 27-yard Trevor Austin field goal with five seconds left on the game clock.

Although the Flames dominated the scoreboard with a 21-3 halftime lead, the first half statistics for both teams were very similar. Liberty outgained Gardner-Webb, 205 to 149 yards, with 152 of Liberty's yards coming from its passing game. The Bulldogs pieced together a more balanced attack with 78 rushing yards and 71 passing yards.

Brown led the Flames' first-half charge, completing 9-of-14 passing attempts for 152 yards and two scoring strikes. Holloway was Liberty's leading rusher with nine carries for 23 yards, while Summers was Brown's top target with four catches for 90 yards.

Beatty finished the opening period 7-of-12 for 71 yards, including three passes to Little for 29 yards. Little also led the Bulldogs on the ground with 11 carries for 65 yards. Brown continued to be efficient in the passing game to open the second half, completing his first nine passing attempts to lead Liberty to its next scoring drive.

On Liberty's second drive of the third quarter, a nine-play, 86-yard drive, Brown capped off the effort with a 17-yard throw to tight end Tommy Shaver over the middle to push Liberty's advantage to 25 points, 28-3, with 6:33 left to play in the period.

Liberty's stout defense continued to stymie Gardner-Webb during the second 30-minute period, as the Bulldogs' longest drive of the half was a nine-play, 38-yard drive that ended when they gave the ball over on downs.

Liberty managed to score one last time on the afternoon early in the fourth quarter. Brown passes to Summers (12 yards), Holloway (15 yards) and Shaver (30

yards) set up a two-yard touchdown run by Aldreakis Allen with 11:40 left in the ball game.

The Flames have now held consecutive opponents without a touchdown, with Liberty's last touchdown allowed taking place at 9:16 during the third quarter of the Lehigh game. Liberty's recent defensive success has lowered Liberty's defensive points allowed average to 17.8 per game.

The second half was dominated by the Flames in offensive yards, as Liberty finished with a 289 to 139 total offensive yards in the half to give Liberty a 494 to 288 overall advantage during the game. Liberty finished the game with 10 more offensive plays than Gardner-Webb, but the Flames averaged 7.0 yards per play to Gardner-Webb's 4.7 average.

For the seventh time in Rocco's six years at Liberty, the Flames surpassed the 300-yard passing mark.

Brown finished the afternoon with a career-high 363 passing yards, the highest passing total for a Flames' quarterback since Biff Parson threw for 388 yards against East Tennessee State on Sept. 2, 2000.

Brown's previous career high came against St. Francis (Pa.) to open the 2010 season at Lynchburg's City Stadium, where he threw for 338 yards and four touchdowns.

Desmond Rice led the Flames on the ground with a career-high nine carries for 52 yards, with all of his yards and carries coming during the fourth quarter. Holloway carried the bulk of the load during the first three quarters, finishing the afternoon with 13 carries for 35 yards.

Liberty had its first double 100-yard receiving game since the previously mentioned St. Francis (Pa.) match-up when Summers, B.J. Hayes and Pat Kelly all crossed the 100-yard threshold.

Summers recorded his ninth career 100-yard game to lead the Flames with nine receptions for 133 yards, including his 33-yard touchdown score.

Game No. 7 - Liberty 63, No. 20 Coastal Carolina 27

Oct. 15, 2011 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (19,111)

The Liberty Flames scored on their first seven drives of the game and never looked back en route to a 63-27 Homecoming victory over No. 20 Coastal Carolina inside of Williams Stadium.

For the second week in a row, the Flames jumped out to a 14-0 lead during the first six minutes of the game.

This go around, Liberty's quick start came on the strength of its running game. On a blustery afternoon, the Flames elected to keep the ball on the ground eight of the first 10 plays and quickly amassed 105 rushing yards on the first two drives.

The run-game burst started on the game's first offensive play, when Sirchauncey Holloway found a hole on the right side of the line and lumbered downfield for a 59-yard gain. The run by the junior running back set up a five-yard touchdown carry by Mike Brown just 21 seconds in the game.

Coastal Carolina's first possession of the game did not last long, as Marcus Whitener was struck by Cory Freeman and the ensuing loose ball was recovered by Chris Mayo.

The Chanticleers' defense stopped the Flames on their next drive, forcing Liberty to punt. However, Mike Larsson was tackled during the special teams play, giving Liberty a new set of downs on the Coastal Carolina side of the field.

Liberty kept the ball on the ground for the next five plays, including a six-yard touchdown run by Aldreakis Allen at the 9:52 mark. Allen's third rushing touchdown of the season capped off an eight-play, 53-yard drive that staked Liberty to a 14-0 lead.

Turnovers continued to hurt the visitors, as Coastal Carolina gave the ball back to Liberty on the fourth play of the next drive. Mayo, who recovered the first fumble of the game, caused the next when he jarred the ball free from running back Jeremy Height, which was picked up by Paco Varol.

A 20-yard pass over the middle to tight end Tommy Shaver from Brown got Liberty back into the red zone for the third-straight drive. From there, the Walter Payton Award candidate quarterback called his number on four plays in a row, including a one-yard run to complete a nine-play, 53-yard scoring drive with 4:30 left to play in the opening stanza and make the score 21-0, Flames.

Liberty's stout defense continued to hold strong, forcing a pair of three-and-out series and a third turnover. The three drives resulted in three more touchdowns, allowing Liberty to open up a 42-0 lead with 3:16 left before halftime.

Two of the three scoring drives went for 10 or more yards, with both ending in rushing touchdowns. The first was a two-yard run by Allen at 13:57 of the second quarter, followed by Desmond Rice's first career touchdown run, for one yard, at 7:40.

Liberty's final scoring drive of the first half saw Brown find Peter Gagliardi open for his first career touchdown reception, a 32-yarder, that pushed Liberty's margin to 42 points. Following Gagliardi's 32-yard reception, Liberty had used its 40 plays to amass 289 yards, while having held the Chanticleers to 79 yards on 12 plays.

Coastal Carolina was finally able to mount its first scoring drive of the game on the final drive of the first half. The Chanticleers implemented a hurry-up offense which allowed them to quickly move the ball downfield and eventually score on a 20-yard touchdown pass from Aramis Hillary to Chris Presley with three seconds left before the break. As a result, the Flames' halftime advantage stood at 42-7.

At the intermission, Liberty more than doubled up Coastal Carolina in total offense yards, having outgained the visitors 346 to 155 yards.

Brown continued to be Liberty's top offensive weapon, as the senior collected 204 yards of Liberty's first-half yardage. He completed 13-of-17 passing attempts for 144 yards, while rushing for two scores and 61 yards on 13 carries. Chris Summers was Liberty's top target, finishing the first 30 minutes with five receptions for 83 yards.

The Chanticleers tried to gain the momentum for the first time in the game early in the second half, doing so by cutting Liberty's lead from 35 points to 21. Coastal Carolina did so on a pair of quick plays. The first was a 44-yard completion from Hillary to Adrian Sullivan at the 9:31 mark followed by a 32-yard flea-flicker pass from DeMario Bennett to Matt Hazel just three minutes later.

However, Liberty squelched the visitors' hopes of continuing their comeback effort by scoring the next two times the Flames touched the ball to put the game out of reach.

The Flames would score three more times, giving Liberty its third-most points scored in a single game under Rocco.

Rice scored his second rushing touchdown of the game (one yard) at the 4:51 mark, while Brown completed a 50-yard touchdown pass to Pat Kelly a minute and a half later. Finally, Liberty's special teams got into the mix on the 60-point effort when Ryan Ferguson blocked a Austin Cain punt and Bobby Partilla recovered it in the end zone for a score.

Special teams also played a factor into the final scoring drive of the game, as Liberty muffed the last punt of the game and gave the visitors the ball at the 10-yard line. Four plays later, Cody Craig found Bennett open on a sideline route with 59 seconds left to complete the evening's final scoring effort.

The Flames had their highest offensive output of the season, finishing the afternoon with 518 total offensive yards. Liberty's season-best effort saw the Flames complete the night with an even 259 rushing yards and 259 passing yards.

Brown played a part in four of Liberty's touchdowns. The senior threw for two scores, completing 13-of-17 passing attempts for 218 yards, while rushing for two more on 13 carries and 61 yards.

Allen was Liberty's top rusher, as the sophomore posted his third career multiple rushing touchdown game. He scored twice on the ground and finished the game rushing 19 times for 96 yards to help the Flames post their second 200-plus yard rushing performance in three games.

Summers' first-half numbers stood to lead Liberty's receiving efforts, while Kelly caught three passes for 64 yards and his second receiving touchdown of the season.

Francis Bah finished the game with a career-best eight tackles to lead the Flames. The defensive line had four solo and four assisted tackles, to go along with two tackles for a loss and a quarterback hurry.

Game No. 8 - Liberty 38, Charleston Southern 16

Oct. 22, 2011 - Charleston, S.C. - CSU Stadium (3,375)

Liberty took advantage of Charleston Southern's inability to score early, jumping out to a 31-point first-half lead en route to a 38-16 Big South victory inside CSU Stadium.

During the game's first few drives, the two teams felt each other out, as the game remained scoreless until late in the first quarter.

Liberty was able to get onto the scoreboard, thanks to another lengthy touchdown pass from Mike Brown to Pat Kelly.

Four plays prior, Nick Sigmon sacked Charleston Southern quarterback Malcolm Dixon on a fourth-and-five play at the Liberty's 31-yard line to give the Flames their second possession of the afternoon.

Runs by Aldreakis Allen and Brown got Liberty a first down, setting up a 52-yard pass play over the middle to Kelly to give Liberty a 7-0 lead with 1:56 left in the opening stanza. It marked the fifth time Kelly has caught a 50-plus yard touchdown pass among his seven career touchdown receptions.

The Flames forced their second three-and-out series and then methodically marched downfield to double their lead early in the second quarter.

Keying the 13-play, 79-yard drive was Liberty's ability to pick up a new set of downs on three third-down plays. The third and final time Liberty accomplished the feat got the Flames into the end zone, as Brown rolled out of the pocket and found Allen open on a six-yard slant with 9:16 left to play before halftime.

Charleston Southern responded by piecing together its longest drive of the opening 30 minutes, a 53-yard effort that got down to Liberty's seven-yard line.

However, Liberty's defense came up with a record-setting play in the red zone. On a third-and-six play, Dixon tried to find an open receiver in the end zone; however, KaJuan Lee stepped in front of the pass and returned it 100 yards for a touchdown at the 6:15 mark.

The seven-point play gave Liberty a 21-0 lead and the Flames' longest interception return in program history. The 100-yard return by Lee surpassed Marcus Harvey's 95-yard return against Appalachian State in 1997.

The two teams traded possessions with the second pinning Charleston Southern deep in its own territory with just over two minutes left to play before halftime.

On the first play of the Buccaneers' drive, Dixon tried to get rid of the ball over the middle, but Scott Hyland picked off the pass, returning it 22 yards for a score. The sophomore nearly was tackled two yards short, but he finished off his first career interception by stretching out the ball over the goal line before hitting the ground to give Liberty a 28-0 lead.

The Flames forced their third three-and-out series of the first half on Charleston Southern's ensuing drive and took over possession with 1:16 left on the second quarter clock.

Liberty quickly moved downfield, aided mostly by a 35-yard pass play from Brian Hudson to Allen to help the Flames cross midfield. Two plays later, Allen got to the outside, picking up a first down and putting the Flames in field goal range.

Following a Charleston Southern timeout, Liberty's field goal unit was called onto the field, where Matt Bevins knocked down a 29-yard field goal to close out the first half of play.

The Flames more than doubled up Charleston Southern's offensive output during the opening half of the game, 284 yards to 135. The Flames rushed for 160 yards, while passing for another 124 yards.

Allen was Liberty's top offensive weapon, rushing for 115 yards on 13 carries. Brown finished the half with five carries for 31 yards, while completing 6-of-14 passing attempts for two scores and 89 passing yards.

Already up by 31 points coming out of halftime, the Flames completely put the game out of reach for the home squad on the first play of the second half.

Kevin Fogg fielded the Tyson Pryor opening kickoff at his own 18-yard line and got several key blocks downfield to put the Flames up 38-0 following a 82-yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

The Flames only managed to amass 22 total offensive yards during the remainder of the game, while Charleston Southern used the time to score 16 points.

Charleston Southern's first two scoring efforts were lengthy drives. The first, an 11-play, 59-yard drive, got the home team on the scoreboard with 5:33 left in the third when Mike Davis caught a 12-yard pass play from Charleston Southern back-up quarterback Richard Mounce.

The second was a 39-yard field goal by Andy Brown with 12:21 left to play in the fourth quarter, finishing off a 15-play, 72-yard drive.

The Buccaneers managed to cross the goal line one more time during the game's final minute. Mounce lofted a ball to Nathan Perera in the corner of the end zone with 52 seconds left, giving Charleston Southern its final score of the afternoon.

Liberty's scoring was evenly disbursed on the afternoon, with all three phases of the game adding points to the scoreboard. Liberty's offense and defense contributed 14 points apiece, while the special teams unit finishing the afternoon with 10 points.

With the Buccaneers' strong second-half effort, Charleston Southern outgained Liberty during the 60 minutes of play by 97 yards, 403 to 306 yards.

The total marked the lowest offensive output for the Flames in a victory since finishing with only 165 yards in a 20-13 victory over Charleston Southern on the same field on Oct. 24, 2009.

Allen had a career day, rushing for 126 yards on 16 carries, surpassing his previous career high of 112 yards against West Virginia Wesleyan in 2009.

Brown suffered an injury during the final drive of the first half and did not return to the game. The senior finished the day with 120 total offensive yards (31 rushing, 89 passing), marking his first career start as a Liberty quarterback without producing at least 200 yards of total offense (18 career starts at quarterback).

Hudson, who played the entire second half under center, finished the afternoon 4-of-9 with 41 passing yards.

Kelly ended the day as Liberty's top wide receiver, catching four passes for 70 yards, including the 52-yard first half touchdown reception. Allen followed behind with three receptions for 47 yards.

Game No. 9 - No. 23/24 Liberty 27, Presbyterian Co. 20 (2OT)

Oct. 29, 2011 - Lynchburg, Va. - Williams Stadium (11,673)

No. 23/24 Liberty got a late offensive push in regulation and stopped the visiting Blue Hose during the second overtime to scratch out a 27-20 victory over Presbyterian College inside Williams Stadium.

The Flames continued to find first-drive success in Big South play, scoring on their first drive for the third time in four league games to jump out to a quick lead.

Liberty won the coin toss and elected to take possession to open the game on a drive that penetrated deep into Blue Hose territory.

The nine-play, 59-yard drive was highlighted by a 32-yard run by Aldreakis Allen and an 18-yard pass play from Mike Brown to Chris Summers.

The Brown to Summers connection got Liberty to the one-yard line. However, Presbyterian College's defense was able to stop three-straight rushing attempts, leaving the Flames to settle for an 18-yard Alex Kacere field goal at the 11:22 mark.

Unlike the Flames' previous Big South games this season, that would be the last time either team would add points to the scoreboard during the opening 30 minutes, as Liberty's 3-0 lead held up the remainder of the half.

Liberty's defense continued to dominate Big South opponents during the first half, keeping a second opponent scoreless during the opening 30 minutes. In four Big South games, the Flames have allowed only 10 first-half points.

Liberty limited the visitors to 104 total offensive yards and five first downs. On a blustery day inside of Williams Stadium, Presbyterian College elected to keep the ball on the ground most of the first half. The Blue Hose picked up 84 of their 104 yards on 14 rushing attempts.

The Flames' offense, which came into the game outscoring Big South opponents 101-10 during the first half, was unable to find any rhythm for most of the day. Liberty finished the opening half with 228 total offensive yards, evenly split with 115 rushing and 113 passing yards.

Brown finished the opening half 12-of-19 for 113 yards, but the quarterback did throw his first interception in three games to result in the only first-half turnover.

Allen gained most of Liberty's yards on the ground, as the sophomore rushed 10 times for 78 yards. Brown also carried the ball eight times for 32 yards before the intermission.

The two teams traded short possessions to open the second half, with neither team mustering any additional offense during their first possessions of third quarter.

The Blue Hose, who had just cracked the 100-total offensive yard mark during the first half, nearly doubled their total on one play.

On a misdirection play, Ryan Singer found a hole on the left side of the line, leaving an open field between the quarterback and the end zone for a 74-yard touchdown run.

The lengthy play, the longest in Presbyterian College's Division I era, gave the visitors a 7-3 advantage with 11:11 left to play on the third quarter game clock. The four-point lead by the Blue Hose marked the first time the Flames have trailed in a Big South game this season.

The Flames responded by putting together their longest drive of the afternoon, a 13-play, 79-yard effort that ended in the red zone. Liberty had to settle for its second field goal of the game, a 30-yarder by Kacere to pull the Flames with one, 7-6, with 3:51 left in the third.

The score remained the same until midway through the fourth quarter. Presbyterian College looked like it was poised to score its second touchdown of the game, getting to Liberty's one-yard line.

However, back-to-back penalties continued to push the visitors back and the Blue Hose left the drive with a 29-yard Aaron Mayes field goal to boost their margin to four points, 10-6, with 9:35 left in regulation.

Liberty looked like it was going to respond, as the Flames drove to the Presbyterian College two-yard line. But, the visitors stopped Liberty on three-consecutive plays, including an attempted rush by Brown on fourth-and-two to create a turnover on downs.

Liberty forced a quick three-and-out series on the next drive and got a 41-yard punt return by Ervin Garner to start the Flames just 12 yards from the Presbyterian

College end zone.

Following a six-yard pass play from Brown to Pat Kelly, Allen took a handoff and found the end zone for Liberty's first touchdown of the game. The six-yard burst to the right side gave Liberty a 13-10 edge with 1:32 left to play.

The Flames elected to squib kick the ensuing kickoff, which gave Presbyterian College the ball on its own 45-yard line with 1:26 remaining.

The Blue Hose quickly moved downfield seven plays on 50 yards, spotlighted by a 34-yard pass over the middle by Singer to Michael Ruff and a 13-yard run by Lance Byrd. The second mentioned play put the visitors in field goal range. That allowed Mayes to kick a 22-yard field goal with five seconds left, leveling the score at 13-13 and putting Liberty into overtime for the first time since the 2007 season.

Presbyterian College wasted little time reclaiming the lead, as Ruff burst to the outside on the first play of overtime, scoring on a 25-yard run to put the Blue Hose up 20-13.

The Flames took a little longer to respond, as Liberty pieced together a six-play, 25-yard push to knot the score at 20-20. The last play was a three-yard rush by Allen up the middle, where the sophomore's second-effort lunge pushed the nose of the football across the goal line.

Liberty had the first possession of the second overtime period and matched Presbyterian College's quick-strike overtime opener.

Brown rolled out right and lofted a ball into the end zone toward Summers, where the All-America wide receiver went up and took the ball away from defensive back Justin Bethel to put the Flames up 27-20 on Summers' 25th career touchdown.

On the next possession, Presbyterian College managed to get the ball down to the 10-yard line. However, Scott Hyland burst through the line of scrimmage to record a 12-yard sack of Singer, followed by an incomplete pass to Anderico Bailey to give Liberty its 14th-straight Big South victory inside of Williams Stadium.
