2012 NCAA DIVISION I MEN'S GOLF CHAMPIONSHIPS

INDIANAPOLIS---The NCAA Division I Men's Golf Committee has selected the teams and individuals to participate in the 2012 NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championships.

Six 54-hole regional tournaments will be conducted May 17-19. Thirteen teams and ten individuals not on those teams will compete at each of three regionals while the other three regionals will have 14 teams and five individuals not on those teams. The low five teams and the low individual not on those teams from each regional will advance to the finals.

The finals will be conducted May 29-June 3, at The Riviera Country Club in Pacific Palisades, California. The University of Southern California is the host institution for this year's championships.

The Augusta State University men's golf team won the 2011 NCAA Division I Men's Golf Championships, capturing their second consecutive national title. Augusta State defeated the University of Georgia 3-2 in the final round of match play competition. At the end of three rounds of stroke play, John Peterson, from Louisiana State University, shot a 5-under-par 211 to capture the individual title. The tournament was held at Karsten Creek in Stillwater, Oklahoma and was hosted by Oklahoma State University.
