DR. BOYD RIST, Provost Emeritus | 40 years

Distinguished Professor of History Emeritus, Senior Academic Consultant to the Provost

Dr. Boyd C. Rist earned his B.A. at the University of South Dakota, his M.A. at the University of Minnesota, and his Ph.D. at the University of Virginia. A distinguished professor of history, Dr. Rist has been a member of the Liberty University faculty since 1973. His areas of teaching and research focus on political and constitutional history from the American Revolution to the beginning of the Civil War. He has served as chair of the division of Social Sciences, associate dean and dean of the College of Arts and Sciences, dean of the faculty, vice-president for Academic Affairs, and most recently, provost and vice-president for Academic Affairs. In November 2010, the Board of Trustees honored Dr. Rist with the title of "Provost Emeritus."

Dr. Rist's professional affiliations include the American Conference of Academic Deans, the Organization of American Historians, and the Society of Historians of the Early Republic. He is also a member of Phi Beta Kappa, Phi Alpha Theta, Pi Sigma Alpha, and Phi Beta Sigma honor societies.

Dr. Rist has served as a member of, and chair of, the Accreditation Commission of the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools. He also served for several years as the accreditation liaison for Liberty University to the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

He and his wife, Norma Jean, are members of Thomas Road Baptist Church. Their daughter, Emily Ruth, lives with her husband, David, in Indianapolis where she is Concertmaster of the Indianapolis Chamber Orchestra. She also performs regularly with the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra and provides private instruction to string students.

Distinguished Professor of History Emeritus Dr. Rist retired from full-time university employment at the end of the 2012-13 academic year, having completed forty years of service.

DR. JAMES VAN EATON, Math | 35 years

Dr. James Van Eaton came to Liberty University in 1978. He attended Prairie Bible Institute before receiving his B.A. in Chemistry from the University of Northern Iowa. Dr. Van Eaton served in the military as an engineer for three years, but continued his education through Kansas State University extension while on active duty. He received his M.S.T. in Natural Science from Tennessee State University and his Ph. D. from the University of Wyoming.

During his stay at Liberty, Dr. Van Eaton developed several new courses. His passion for astronomy led to the creation of a new course called Astronomy: An Integrated Approach. Since 2005, Dr. Van Eaton has been involved in a project to build an observatory at Liberty University. He hopes to stay active in seeing this project to its completion, even after he retires.

One daughter-in-law, Hien Van Eaton, teaches Developmental Math at Liberty. Dr. Van Eaton enjoys spending time with his family and grandchildren.

DR. PAUL FINK, Religion | 34 years

Dr. Paul Fink has served as a faculty member of Liberty University School of Religion since August of 1979, teaching students how to both study and teach Scripture. Studying alongside Dr. Elmer Towns during his years in seminary, Dr. Fink earned degrees from Columbia Bible College (now Columbia International University) and Dallas Theological Seminary, where he earned his Th.M. in Old Testament Literature and Exegesis (Hebrew), as well as his Th.D. in New Testament Literature and Exegesis (Greek). Before coming to Liberty University, Dr. Fink taught at Grace Seminary from 1963-79.

Over the years, his influence in the areas of inductive Bible study and homiletics has served as a pillar for the curriculum of the School of Religion. Since Dr. Fink has had the pleasure of watching some of his former students become colleagues in the School of Religion, his legacy of excellence in the classroom will be carried forward into future generations.

In retirement, Dr. Fink will continue to enjoy spending time with his wife of sixty-two years, Mary, and their six children and grandchildren.

DR. HOMER BLASS, History | 30 years

Dr. Homer Blass came to Liberty in the fall of 1983 and has taught here ever since. He earned a B.A. in History from the University of Tulsa in 1962, an M.A. in History from the University of Illinois — Urbana in 1966, and a Ph.D. in History from the University of Missouri — Columbia in 1981. From 1966 to 1983, he taught history at Southwest Baptist University in Bolivar, Missouri.

At Liberty he has taught a wide range of courses, including American History I and II, Modern Russia, Modern Germany, Modern Middle East, British Empire, American Diplomacy, and American Military History. He remains widely loved by his students and respected by his colleagues.
