ECONOMIC AND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT OF SPORT

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course provides a comprehensive synopsis of the application of economics and financial management used in the sport organization decision making context from both a macro and micro level.

RATIONALE

The theory and practice of corporate finance in a context of micro and macroeconomic principles are essential elements of strategic financial management. The sport enterprise is a multi-billion dollar industry, thus requiring sound financial guidelines and principles for a sport company or organization to maneuver successfully and with prosperity through the marketplace. Since financing is the source by which any sport company or organization functions, it is imperative that students understand and apply key concepts to the financial decision-making process to enable the company to maintain success.
