### **Graduation Requirements**

Complete 36 hours

A maximum of 50% of the program hours may be transferred if approved and allowable, including credit from an earned degree from Liberty University on the same academic level

3.0 GPA

No more than two grades of C may be applied to the degree (includes grades of C+ & C-) No grade of D or below may be applied to the degree (includes grades of D+ & D-) Degree must be completed within 5 years

Submission of Degree Completion Application must be completed within the last semester of a student's anticipated graduation date

All applicable prerequisites must be met

<sup>3</sup>Students may take two elective courses<sup>4</sup> instead of CJUS 689 & 690

<sup>5</sup>While CJUS 689 may be taken more than once, only one enrollment in the course will be permitted to count toward degree requirements
