### **Graduation Requirements**

Complete 54 hours

A maximum of 50% of a post-graduate and doctoral degree may be transferred if approved and allowable, including credit from an earned degree from Liberty University on the same academic level

No grades lower than a B- may be applied to the degree

Successful completion of Capstone Project

Degree must be completed within 7 years\*

Submission of Degree Completion Application must be completed within the last semester of a student's anticipated graduation date

\*There is a limit of 5 years for completion of the Ed.D. for students who were granted 18 hours or more of advanced standing credit from a previously completed Ed.S. or equivalent degree

### Offered in Online Format

All applicable prerequisites must be met

<sup>2</sup>A minimum of 20 Doctoral credit hours must be earned prior to enrollment in EDUC
