30 Credit hours of undergraduate courses must be upper-level (300-400 level)

Grade of 'C' Minimum required for all **undergraduate** courses in the major

Grade of 'B-' Or higher required for all **graduate** courses, including NURS 500 and 503

50% Of the coursework (up to 78 credit hours) may be transferred if approved and allowable, including credit from an earned degree from Liberty University on the same academic level
