³Gate 3 – Successful Completion of PHGT 513 (Electronic Student Portfolio)

⁴Gate 4 – Successful Completion of PHGT 514 (Competency Exam) with a passing score of 70% or better. Students have three attempts to take the exam. Failure to pass the exam will result in remediation or dismissal from the program.

⁵Choose any 500-600 level HLTH or PUBH course not already required by the degree, or any other 500-600 level course with department chair approval.

⁶Gate 5 – Successful Completion of PUBH 689 AND EPDM 690. These courses must be taken concurrently.
