

Technical Requirements

As you prepare to take Ember courses, please pay attention to our technical requirements.

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Ember's online programs are entirely online, so computers or devices that are compatible with any modern web browser will suffice for the vast majority of the student needs.

Web Browsers

Most of the curriculum can run on the latest version of any modern browser. Ember's curriculum is compatible with the following browsers, though Chrome is the recommended browser.

- Chrome (recommended)
- Firefox
- Safari*
- Edge*

*Is not compatible with certain features, not recommended

Computer/Device

<u>Use of a desktop or laptop is recommended as an optimal experience cannot be guaranteed on a Chromebook, tablet, iPad, or mobile phone.</u>

The following specifications are recommended for operating the curriculum.

Media & Printing

Some courses require students to print materials or to record video, pictures, or audio for part of an assignment. This is found most prevalently in Elementary.

Printer: Needed for some courses Camera & Mic: Needed for some courses (can be from a phone or tablet)

Software

Access to all of the software that is needed to operate the curriculum is provided to the student as part of being in our program! The student needs only to have the latest version of a modern web browser (e.g. <u>Google Chrome</u>, available for free) to access the online curriculum. Students may also need to download <u>Adobe Reader</u> (free) to view PDF documents.

Internet Filtering

Your student's internet safety and accountability is of utmost importance to us. There are several internet filtering software solutions on the market. All Ember content has been curated by Subject Matter Experts to fit the educational needs of your student in a manner that a professional, academic, and distinctly Christian. Nevertheless, some filtering software have sometimes been known to block educational content. Some filtering issues can be circumvented by "whitelisting" https://luoa.instructure.com (not including "www.") as well as other sites linked to from within the curriculum.

Note that educational videos from YouTube are used within the curriculum.
