Your student is eligible for the original LU-LCA Scholarship program, which is calculated on the number of years of high school completed at LCA. Each year of high school completed earns your student a 25% LU tuition scholarship (after other non-loan aid is subtracted) up to 100% of tuition.



Your student is eligible for a 10% LU-LCA Scholarship for each K-12 grade completed at LCA between January 24, 2012 (the 2011-12 academic year), and the end of the 2015-16 academic year, for up to a 50% LU tuition scholarship. The number of academic years completed between January 24, 2012, and the end of the 2015-16 academic year, is _____ x 10% = %.

Your student is not eligible to stack their LU-LCA Scholarship with other Liberty University-funded institutional aid or scholarships.

This means that when they begin college, they must choose to either use their LU-LCA scholarship only or use their other Liberty institutional financial aid (whichever is better for them financially) with federal and state grants for which they qualify.

Note: each scenario requires a minimum GPA of 2.75+, as well as an SAT of 980+ or an ACT of 19+, for eligibility.
